U. S. Seeks Asia Treaty of Defense

Washington, April 7 (AP)—The United States has proposed that 10 nations join in a defensive agreement underwriting the security of southeast Asia, including Indonesia, against Communist conquest.

The proposal is under discussion with friendly governments. Some of them, diplomatic informants indicated today, have reacted favorably.

The British Government has not yet made a decisive response, however, and officials here consider Britain's reaction of utmost importance to the success of the plan.

The proposed agreement would be the first step in a program of what Secretary of State Dean Rusk called "united action" to secure southeast Asia from Communist aggression.

The contractors, builders, and those in allied trades, members of the Chamber of Commerce, held an organization meeting last night at the Manchester Country Club. The group adopted its official name CAM, "Contractors Association of Manchester, a division of the Manchester Chamber of Commerce."

The nominating committee: Frank Dougan, William Glenney, Frank Gambolatti and Clinton Hendricksen, chairman, brought in a slate of officers for the coming year. Orlando Annulli was elected chairman. Thomas Colla, vice chairman; Frank Gambolatti, treasurer; Paul Phillips, secretary; and Marion Steveson, assistant secretary. Colla, who headed the Contractors Division in the membership drive of the Chamber, served as temporary chairman until the election of Annulli. Colla congratulated Annulli on his election as chairman of the CAM, the first organized group of contractors in Manchester. Annulli thanked the group for the confidence and assured them he would do everything in his power to promote the organization.

Laif Objectives

CAM adopted the following objective: (a) To associate the contractors of Manchester for the purpose of mutual advantage and cooperation; (b) To cooperate with all branches of the contracting industry including manufacturers, dealers and financial institutions within the jurisdiction of this organization for the purpose of mutual advantage and for the benefit of the industry as a whole; (c) To secure a code of ethics to maintain high professional standards and high business methods among our members; (d) To secure cooperative action in advancing the industry; (e) To assist its members, uniformly and equitably in business usages and laws and proper consideration of opinions upon questions affecting the contracting industry.

Humphrey Assails Exemptions Plans

earliest possible action on the bill was "imperative" and would have a "tremendously helpful effect upon the economy."

Humphrey read off a list of what he called "plain facts" about the current economic situation indicating that business is now better than at any other time except in the record year of 1953.

Humphrey told the senators that giving faster and more flexible tax write-off of depreciation would benefit 9,600,000 individuals, including farmers and small business men, as well as 600,000 corporations.

Sen. Long (D-La.) interjected on the point of reducing taxes on dividend income, it was his information that six-tenths of the 80 per cent of American families own 80 per cent of the stock in the country.

Humphrey said the revision bill was designed to reform the tax system, eliminating inequities and injustices accumulated over the last 75 years.

Sen. Vandenberg (R-Mich.) said prior to Humphrey's appearance that if the Democrats persuade Congress to cut income taxes again this year, the revenue loss would be made up by a general sales tax.

The bill makes assorted tax cuts totaling \$1,400,000,000 for individuals and businesses in its first year of operation, but it does not reduce personal income taxes, which dropped an average of 10 per cent on Jan. 1.
