Included in the 44 figure used by McCarthy in his broadcast, "Twenty of the 79 witnesses were labeled by McCarthy as Communists whose work was used in either the McCarthy or State Dept. information programs."
Three of the 79 were employed by the government at the time they were questioned, though one of these was subpoenaed Communist. The remainder of the 84 mentioned in the broadcast had various backgrounds—employers, former employees of defense plants, former employees of the Communist party, employees of private organizations, or teachers.

On March 8, 1950, McCarthy appeared before a special subcommittee of the Senate Foreign Relations Committee and named nine persons. They were: Philip C. Jessup, U. S. Ambassador-Large; Owen Lattimore, Johns Hopkins University professor; Dorothy Kenyon, chief of the Technical Cooperation Projects staff of the Point Four Program; Mrs. Esther Cavert, State Dept. administrative aide; Gustav Duran, employed by the State Dept., 1945-46; Dorothy Kenyon, New York attorney and former member of the Commission on the Status of the United Nations; Frederick L. Schuman, professor at Williams College; John Stewart Service, State Dept. advisor; and Earl Browder, former Communist Party leader.
