Coventry Additional \$10,000 Is Voted To Pay for School Design

Coventry, April 27 (Special)—An additional \$10,000 was voted to help defray the increased cost of design for the projected 16-room elementary school last night when some 40 citizens showed up for the town meeting.

The additional funds will be added to a previous appropriation of some \$350,000 which was originally slated to pay for the cost of site, site development, engineering survey of site and architectural cost for completed plans in an 8-room school building.

On Sept. 15, 1954, the town had approved a proposed 8-room school, but it was subsequently decided to expand the project to a 16-room unit. Last night the voters authorized the town officials to borrow the necessary funds.

In other matters considered at the meeting, an ordinance was adopted to regulate the disposal of old ice boxes, refrigerators, freezers and similar containers. Under the new law, no person or corporation will be permitted to place or dispose of any discarded or abandoned ice boxes, etc., or other containers with air-tight doors or snap lock device, which may not be released for opening from the inside.

The law pertaining to ice boxes etc. in any vacant lot or dump area within any zoning or planning district, shall be no more than 25 feet by 10 feet. The voters also authorized the town to cooperate with the 8-member bipartisan committee to investigate the desirability of hardening street, west in the town. They were also instructed to report back to the voters in 60 days.

All section 2 in Waterford Park will be sold by the Board of Selectmen for \$25. The highest bid received for the lot at a recent auction was \$10. A previous town meeting had authorized the board to sell for less than \$50.

First Selectman Godwin W. Jacobs reported on three possible town dump sites. He said the State Board of Health is expected to investigate these within a week or ten days. The results of the findings will be presented to a future town meeting for action by the voters.
