### ZBA to Hear 15 Requests

The British American Club is looking into the possibility of erecting an addition to its present building at 75 Maple St., indicated by an application submitted for the next public hearing of the Zoning Board of Appeals, to be held Monday evening, May 24, in the Municipal Building hearing room.

Permission is sought to construct an addition to the club which is within 1,000 feet of other liquor outlets, in Business Zone II.

Officers of the club are in the process of securing vital information to be presented for consideration by the membership. No action could be taken without the approval of the members. Plans being considered are a 20 by 40 feet addition to the north side of the present building that would provide additional room for activities carried on by the club and provide much-needed storage space.

Outcome of this application, one of 15 to be heard by the ZBA, would determine the course of action to be followed by the officers.

2. Regional forces, former provincial troops, auxiliary guards and regional soldiers, about 50,000.

3. The provincial militia drawn from self defense units in North, south and central Viet Nam. He said he expected important U. S. contributions toward arming the new army elements.

As now constituted, the new national army following a pattern established several years ago by the Communist-led Vietminh.

Gen. Hinh said recruiting for all three branches will be done through the regular army, but there would be no limits of age for the provincial militia, the job of the three, whose chief job will be to defend their homes and villages. Regional troops until now have carried out missions somewhere in between police and regular army functions, and will be used to eliminate lack of coordination between the militia and regional forces on one side and regular army of French Union troops on the other. He said that often in the past non-regular troops had carried out operations independently of regular troops and had coordinated future military action.

More Evacuated. At Hanoi, the French Command says it has evacuated the wounded from captured Dien Bien Phu and hopes to fly out 100 more today.

Helicopters and Beaver aircraft were making the slow but steady shuttle from Dien Bien Phu to the royal Laotian capital of Luang Prabang where the wounded are relayed to Hanoi by Dakota transports.

The evacuation was slowed down last night by violent monsoon rains which made flying impossible for several hours. As a result only 50 were flown out yesterday instead of the scheduled 120.

A High Command spokesman said there still was no word about Dien Bien Phu's lone French Air Force nurse—Miss Genevieve De Claret-Terrault. He said all that was known of rebel plans to release the nurse, 25-year-old, was the announcement, to that effect by a Vietnamese spokesman in Geneva, Swiss city.

Recently arrived casualties from Dien Bien Phu said Miss De Claret-Terrault was "with our wounded day and night."

One Foreign Legionnaire told newsmen at Lanessan Hospital that she was being helped by two French male nurses. He said they were aiding a corps of some 20 captive doctors.

Her friends in Hanoi believe the nurse will stay on until the last of the wounded is evacuated. The Vietnamese have indicated they will permit release of 750 altogether.

It was not yet known whether the rebels intend to repair Dien Bien Phu's shell-pocked air strip to permit big Dakota transports to land and thus speed up the evacuation.

Since Shuttle. The French said they would go on with the slow, piecemeal shuttle in hopes some improvisations might be worked out at the Geneva conference.

The French continued to drop food and medical supplies to the 2,000 wounded in the captured northwest Indochina fortress. Yesterday, four top French generals went to Lanessan Hospital here in Hanoi to decorate wounded survivors of the siege. Leading the group was Gen. Paul Ely, chairman of France's Joint Chiefs of Staff. Later the generals conferred with key French commanders from all the vital sectors of Vietnam troops moving eastward from Dien Bien Phu. Foremost was the question whether France is sending enough troop reinforcements to Indochina by sea and air to beat off any massive attacks on the strategic delta.

Maj. Gen. John W. O'Daniel, chief of the U. S. Military Advisory Commission in Indochina, planned to leave Saigon for Manila tomorrow to confer with U. S. Secretary of Defense Wilson. They are expected to take up:

cents of one per cent from mid-March to mid-April, lowering the index to 114.6 per cent of the 1947-49 average. This is seven-tenths of one per cent below the October, 1953 peak when the index was 115.4. The April index, however, is eight-tenths of one per cent above a year ago.

Commissioner Owen Clague of the bureau said April deflation was entirely due to the April 1 excise tax cut and the index would have remained unchanged without the cut.

Food prices rose in April 2.3 three-tenths of one per cent, mainly due to higher prices for fresh fruits and vegetables, potatoes, lettuce, some meats and coffee.

This was countered by lower prices for clothing, seasonal fixtures in coal prices, and lower costs of home furnishings, household operations and personal care.

Clague said that about half of the excise tax cut was passed on to consumers. He noted that the tax on movie admission was one of those not passed on to consumers. Other excise tax reductions were carried only in part to the retail level.

Prices still are pretty stable, Clague told a news conference. They are not at a very great rate. "Some prices are strengthening. This general strengthening conceals some quite spectacular changes up and down."

The wage cut for the group of 1,200,000 workers comes on the heels of another pay-cut—hourly pay reduction in their last quarter—living cost adjustment before the government's January index. However, most of them will get a five-cent hourly raise at the end of this month. This is the sixth five-cent-an-hour annual improvement factor provided for in contracts between the CIO Auto Workers Union and major motor car producers.

While consumer prices are edging downward, hourly pay rates of workers remain at near record levels, although their actual earnings are reported lower by the labor department because of reduced working hours.

### Paris Asks Truce First In Viet Nam

The United States was understood to feel further talks are futile, but the American delegation believes France should be the one to break off negotiations.

The French are reluctant to break off talks until they have exhausted every possibility because of the difficult political situation in France.

Eisen and De Gaulle will be in Paris Saturday for the 50th anniversary of the Entente Cordiale between Britain and France. De Gaulle undoubtedly will have an opportunity to consult his colleagues on the problem before returning to Geneva.

The French have insisted the president of Laos and Cambodia was appointed from that of Viet Nam. The French plan to end the fighting calls for an immediate withdrawal of all Red forces from Laos and Cambodia and a cessation of Viet Nam.

The Communists, on the other hand, not only are insisting on an armistice in all three associated states but also for political settlements, on some issues before the armistice takes effect.

The two parties seem to be far apart on Indochina as they are on a Korean settlement, which already has been written off by most of the delegates here.

There has been no meeting on Korea in a week, but the talks still have not been broken off. Thailand's Prime Wan Wachiratham said, however, there would be a primary session on Korea tomorrow. He spoke following a meeting of representatives of the 16 nations whose troops fought for the United Nations in Korea.

The prince said Chou and South Korean Foreign Minister Pyung Yung Tai would speak.

The middle of the nations that fought in Korea was followed by a conference of experts from the American, British and French delegations and the three Associated States of Indochina.

Rank Town High In Safety Survey

A highway safety survey covering the first three months of this year has ranked Manchester first in New England and 20th in the country for communities in the 25,000 to 50,000 class.

The survey, based on the number of highway traffic deaths per 10,000 registered motor vehicles was published in "Public Safety" a magazine published by the National Safety Council.
