House Passes Increases for Social Security

a choice of coming in or staying out.

2. Increase the annual wage base on which workers and their employers pay social security taxes and on which benefits are calculated.

3. Boost monthly benefit payments for persons already retired and those retiring in the future.

4. Permit retired persons under 75 to earn more money through part-time or full-time employment without losing benefits.

Include Farmers

Largest new group that would be brought into the social security system include 3,600,000 owners or operators of farms and 1,200,000 farm hands.

Entitled to coverage for the first time also would be 3,500,000 state and local government employees now under state and municipal retirement systems. They would be given the option of staying out. Policemen and firemen were not included.

Some 150,000 Federal employees would be covered for the first time.

Others made eligible for benefits include 400,000 self-employed professionals, about 250,000 domestic workers, 200,000 clergymen and members of religious orders, and 100,000 Americans employed abroad by foreign subsidiaries of U. S. firms.

While raising by \$600 the amount of annual earnings on which workers and employers must pay social security taxes, the bill makes no change in the present 2 per cent tax rate. This is scheduled to rise gradually in future years under existing law.

Provides 88 Boost

More than 3,500,000 persons now drawing social security benefits would get another \$8 a month. Their monthly payments would range from \$10 to \$98.50. These boosts would become effective two months after the bill becomes law.

Paper, Police, CD Flooded With Inquiries on Balloon

"Project Holy Dick," a giant plastic balloon released to map upper altitude air currents, was the object of attention of many people here and in other parts of the state and Massachusetts late yesterday afternoon and evening.

Local police, Civil Defense officials and The Herald received many telephone calls from curious persons seeking what information was available on the object. It was called a "flying saucer," "flying doughnut," "inverted for cream cone," and the "giver meteor." To some it appeared to be an early evening air breeze of the brilliant reflections, but once the sun went down the reflections disappeared.

Jet planes went into the air but could not get close to the egg-shaped balloon, said to be the size of a 6-story building. The inflated altitude of the object was 80,000 feet.

The Cambridge Research Center of the Mass. Institute of Technology said the balloon is 45 feet in diameter and carries instruments suspended from cables beneath it. These instruments are dropped by parachute once the bag reaches 100,000 feet. The bag continues upward until it explodes.

Officials at MIT said the balloon was released as the first of a series of tests in the New England area. A similar balloon was released May 18 at the University of Minnesota under the supervision of the General Mills, Inc., engineers.

Fire District Letter Stirs Maguire Tract Squabble

Commissioners Demand Town Install Hydrant In Disputed Section

The old controversy over the status of the so-called Maguire tract in the eastern section of town is threatening to erupt again, but it appears that the fight will be between officials of the Town Water Dept. and commissioners of the South Manchester Fire District.

The Board of Directors, acting as Water Commissioners, last night refused a five in four vote to install a fire hydrant in the vicinity of Grandview and East Oak Street, as requested by fire officials. A strongly worded letter from the Commissioners, received by the Board last night, hinted at legal action.

The letter, signed by Frank Schenck, secretary of the District, said "Section 5410 of the General Statutes gives us a form of appeal from an unjust decision relative to water service."

The Commissioners want the hydrant installed to protect several homes built in the Maguire tract. The Board of Directors, however, is not prepared to issue no more permits for the area until William Maguire, owner of the land, conforms to subdivision regulations.

Maguire's position, supported by three town councilors, is that the streets in the tract are under responsibility by virtue of their dedication to public use and their acceptance by the public for use.

The majority of the Board members refused to permit installation of the hydrant because they say it would jeopardize the town's legal case if an action was brought to show the town recognized the streets as town responsibility.

Director Everett Kennedy, vigorously opposed a permitting the building of homes in the tract. He said the area is in use "it's all poppycock," he said. "Grass is growing in the streets. He said fences have been erected across the streets and only one fence post has been taken down."

Director Harry Firato said he would like to see the area as you and mine. Somebody allowed the homes to go up and it's our responsibility to protect them. He said the installation of a hydrant would not hurt the town's legal position.

Sherwood Bowers, chairman of the Board, agreed with Firato. Voting against installation were Kennedy, Mrs. Helen Fitzpatrick, Matthew Patton, Walter T. Mabbey, and Theodore Fairbanks.

Kennedy said "I don't know how the Board is going to protect them. It's our responsibility to protect them." He said the installation of a hydrant would not hurt the town's legal position.

Union Files Motion With Supreme Court

Eisenhower Bares Gains In Red War

Attorneys for Local 63, Textile Workers Union of America, CIO, today filed with the State Supreme Court for a writ of habeas corpus involving an arbitrator's decision that granted Cheney Bros. a 10% cost-of-living wage cut.

The motion for the union, whose attorneys claim the union is entitled to a \$200,000 in back wages, claims the decision handed down by the State Supreme Court last week violates the 14th Amendment to the Constitution, thus having the grounds for an appeal to the United States Supreme Court.

Frank Reilly, president of the local, has said the union will carry the fight to the highest court in the land if the state court refuses to rehear the case.

Last week, the state supreme court overruled a superior court judge who last April had vacated the award. The supreme court held in a four-to-one decision that Superior Court Judge Charles J. Conroy erred in failing to correct the award and allowing it to stand.

The award was in effect for eight months, between January 1952 and August 1952, when it was superseded by a second arbitration which granted the company a similar wage cut. The second arbitration was entered into after a compulsory arbitration agreement which the president of the union had signed.

The motion for a rehearing hinges primarily on two points: that the contract which was the basis of the award, still grants the company more than it requested; and that the arbitrator, in granting the award, decided a question involving the arbitrator's power to annul a company contract, which was not properly before him.

In the appeal from the arbitrator's award last year, the union threatened to sue the arbitrator, John Hogan, of the University of New Hampshire, had received all authority by granting a 3 1/2 cent cost-of-living wage cut.

The arbitrator asked for a wage cut in this amount as well as a change in the calculation of the cost-of-living wage back to where they were in March 26, 1951, which generally would add an additional cent-a-year decrease.

The increase averaged out to 3 1/2 cents an hour, or 3 1/2 percent. The workers received more and other than that. Also, about half the workers were paid on an hourly basis, but were pieceworkers who were paid on a piece-work basis by a complex mathematical formula.

Therefore, the effect of Hogan's award was to reduce the wages of those workers most in need of the money. The company, however, has been getting price increases since March 26, 1951, without attempting to take advantage of the award.
