Merits of State Fiscal Year

Subject of the meeting was concerned with learning the advantages and intricacies of changing to what is known on the State Statutes as a Uniform Fiscal Year.

Under its provisions, a town may change its fiscal year of July 1 through June 30. "Since passage of the law in 1933," the meeting was told by Stone, "61 Connecticut towns have changed their fiscal terms to comply with the state term."
