Fringe Benefits Liberalized In Revised Law on Taxes

By CHARLES BARRETT Washington, Aug. 12 (29—Many millions of additional workers are now eligible for tax-exemption on wages received while they are sick. And more liberal ruies have been adopted for taxing other employes sickness or accident benefits, death benefits, and iump-aum payments under pension, profit or stocksharing plans.

All these rules are spelled out in the huge tax revision act received after last Dec. 31, if they apply to such employe benefits received after last Dec. 31, if they are financed by employers under any systematic plan.

If you are covered by such a plans perhaps the most important thing to ramember is this:

If your pay is continued while you, are off work because of sickness or injury, you pay no tax on wages of up to \$100 during the first seven days if your absence is due to accidental injury, or if you are hospittalized at any time during an illness.

Thus, for example, if you make \$100 a week or more and you are out three weeks with an injury or hospital illness, you can deduct \$300 from your taxable income.
