Nine Guilty In Plot to Upset U. S.

Philadelphia, Aug. 12 (AP)—A federal court jury of seven women and five men today found nine alleged Communist leaders guilty of conspiracy to teach and advocate overthrow of the government of the United States by force and violence.

The jury, which heard 47 days of testimony and legal argument, deliberated approximately 100 hours before reaching its verdict. After the panel filed into the courtroom, the clerk asked Foreman Earl C. Glass, Chester, Pa. if a verdict had been reached.

"Yes we have," replied Glass. "How do you find the defendants?" asked the clerk, as he proceeded to read the names of the nine defendants.

Glass answered "guilty" after hearing the charges against them. The nine defendants were charged with "unlawfully, wilfully and knowingly organizing, aiding and abetting to organize, as the Communist Party of the United States of America, a society, group and assembly of persons who teach and advocate the overthrow of the government of the United States by force and violence."

It was the longest trial ever held in the U. S. District Court at Philadelphia, extending over a five-month period that began on May 27.

Court sessions, generally, were held only four days a week. During 47 days of testimony the jury heard more than one million words of testimony and more than 100 hours of legal argument during which the defendants were absent from the courtroom.

The government called 12 witnesses.

Nehru Backs March on Goa By Liberators

New Delhi, India, Aug. 12 (AP)—Prime Minister Nehru gave the green light today for "Liberation March" to the Portuguese Indian territory of Goa next Sunday—provided the marchers are Goans, not Indians, and provided the demonstrators maintain peaceful and non-violent.

Addressing a meeting of the all-India Congress held in Bombay, Nehru said he thought his army could occupy the territory in "a trice" but added, "however, we do not want to use force and we will not use force."

The premier added there could be "only one alternative for Goa—merger with India."

Portugal so far has refused to discuss merger with India. It has offered the marchers a choice of territory on India's west coast. The British, French, and Dutch nations agreed earlier this week to their governments to make an on-the-spot investigation of the Goa situation.

Leaders of the Goa National Congress, based in Bombay, have ordered their pro-Indian supporters to make unarmed entry to Goa Sunday in support of their demands for merger of the territory with India.

The Portuguese, contending almost all of the 500,000 Goans prefer to remain under their control, say they will resist the invasion of all means possible. Some 3,000 policemen and less than 4,000 Portuguese troops.

Nehru did not specify the date of the demonstration called for Sunday but his meaning was clear when he said, "I will not prevent Goans from expressing their feelings about the merger and... no Communist Party agent can interfere with Goans going to the Portuguese settlement."

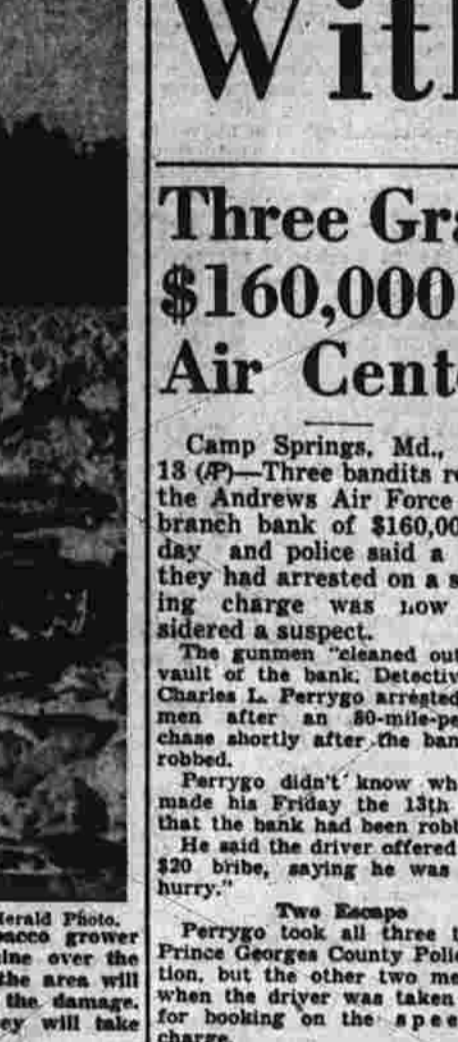
