The CIO workers would reject the 6-cent compromise and added: "Even though we're a different union it looks like one would have supported the other in the joint demands."

A hearing will be held Aug. 27 on a "Tuff-Header" 1 1/2 hour at 8:30 p.m. on the night of the CIO strike.

The CIO workers — members of the gas, coke and chemical workers union — sought 21 cents an hour at first, then scaled demands to 15 while the AFL — members of the atomic trades and labor council — had asked 19 cents.

Party Leader Replies to Ike

Washington, Aug. 20 (AP)—A Democratic leader today replied to President Eisenhower's praise for the Republican-controlled Congress with notice his party will fight the November election battle on the main issues of the administration.

Sen. Lyndon B. Johnson of Texas, the Senate Democratic leader, said in an interview he believes that in the Congressional session which may end today his party has "drawn the lines clearly on the main issues and the people will decide in November who is right."

Eisenhower is a Springfield, Ill. speech yesterday cited tax reduction, flexible farm price supports, expansion of social security coverage and a claimed 10 billion dollar cut in federal spending.

Without direct reference to Eisenhower's remarks, Johnson said he and the Democrats will have succeeded in dramatizing for the "the farm" and "the worker" and the businessman "the sharp difference in philosophy between the two parties."

The Republicans are for tax reduction for the stockholders and the Democrats are for tax reduction for the individual. The Republicans are for farm price supports at 85 per cent and the Democrats are for 50 per cent support.

The Republicans are for keeping the Fair-Hartley law as it is and the Democrats are for amending it. The Republicans are for private power development and monopoly and the Democrats are for atomic energy and the Democrats are against it.
