"Poople are interested in all kinds of speed today," said Big Bill France, a kingpin of the thriving stock car industry, "But to get really excited over it they have to be close enough to see and feel it."

France, who stands 6 feet 4 and weighs 230 pounds, built his own racing car as a raw-boned kid of 20 back in 1929. He drove in 75 races in the days when the rewards came in the form of thrills and peanut prizes.

Big Business Now
But the sport, first popular in the south, started mushrooming across the country in 1935, and its attraction times seem over. It's big business now.

Big Bill is president of the industry—the National Association for Stock Car Auto Racing (NASCAR).

"This possibility of earning up to \$50,000 in a year has attracted many drivers to the NASCAR banner.

Just as horse racing is traditionally defended as a way to "improve the breed," said France, "that we have given an incentive to mechanically minded kids who want a chance to make a little money and win national recognition—and, of course, this also keeps them off the lighway."
