

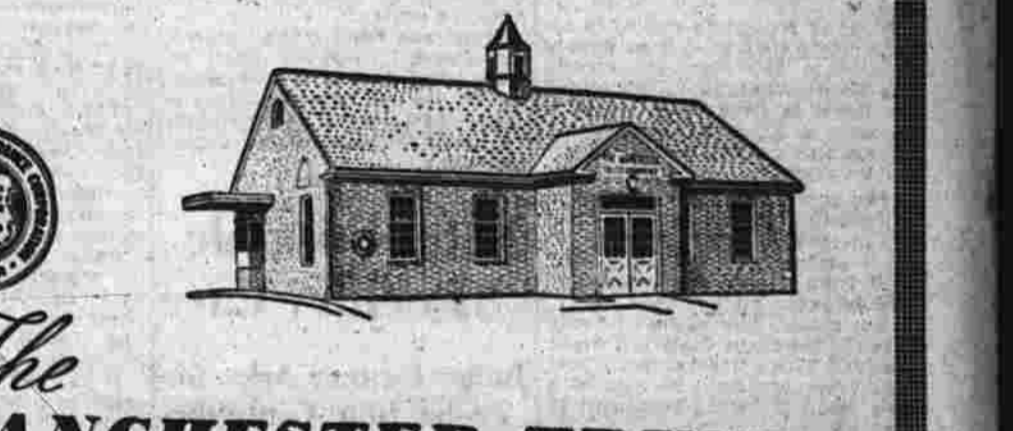

Perishables Spoiled by Power Cut

Telephone Co. had 22,000 telephones still are out in Rhode Island.

In an unprecedented executive order last night, Gov. Hester ordered "all perishable foodstuffs" to remain open today and Monday.

The action came as hundreds of warehouses and stores were working feverishly to restore electricity to the estimated 200,000 homes which were still without power today.

Yards of foodstuffs spoiled in refrigerators that have been power-cut since the hurricane struck, but state officials said loads of dry beans in from the West Indies, helping to keep dairies, packing houses and storage plants in excellent shape.

The unprecedented Sunday sales in stores in Massachusetts, which were put into effect by the governor for those persons who must buy their food from day to day, because of the lack of power refrigeration.

The New England Electric System said its big problem now is the repair of distribution wires and circuits knocked down by fast winds and branches. The system said it stands to lose about two million dollars, representing loss of revenue and cost of repairs.

The total property damage caused by Hurricane Greta which roared into New England on gusts up to 120 miles an hour was estimated unofficially at from 300 to 500 million dollars.

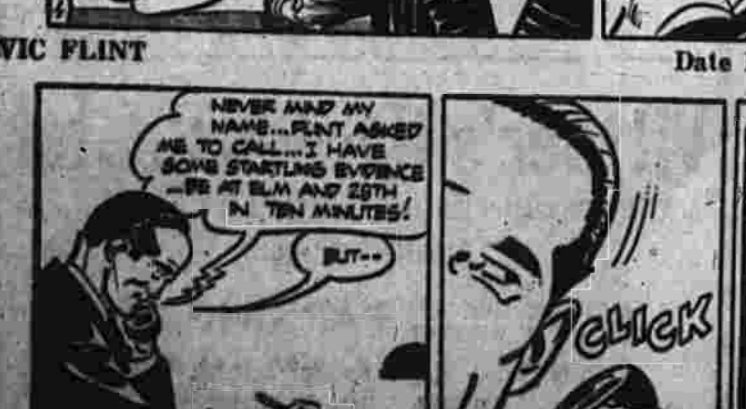

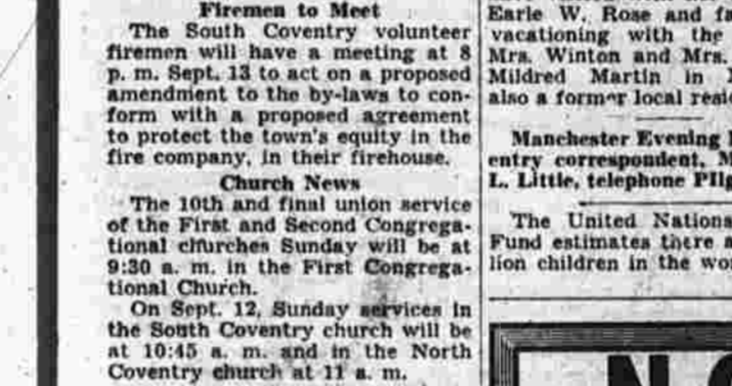

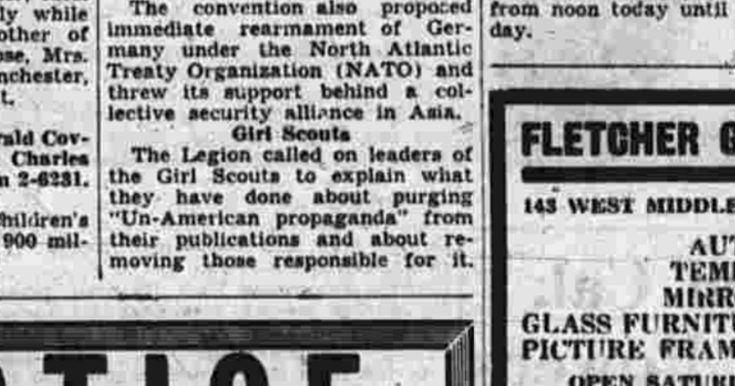
