Although Nazi scientists pulled the trigger on modern rocket warfare, the history of rockets as a weapon dates back at least 1232 A.D., when the Chinese hurled them against the Tariars.

During the early 18th century English troops came under rocket attack in India and by 1806 Sir William Congreve had evolved a rocket so effective that it was used by the British fleet in an attack on Boulogne.

In the war of 1812 the British exploited rockets with dramatic effect at the battle of Bladens-

exploited rockets with dramatic effect at the battle of Bladensburg, Md., Aug. 14, 1814. Two American regiments broke and fled, signaling a general rout which left Washington unprotected. The British promptly marched in and burned the Capitol and the White House.
