





is ripe and ready for harvest. Giglio faced loss of his entire crop without the silos. Locating the two silos, getting them braced and framed for trans-

portation, moving them and set-ing them up in place at his own arm in only a week and two days after Carol struck, was quite a job, he said. Although they were brought from Ellington, only about 15 miles away, the silos had to travel almost twice that distance, Giglio says. Because of their reat size, back roads had to b used in order to escape electric and telephone wires and traffic.

The caravan, comprised of two large trailer trucks with the silos on them, a large Roger-Sherman crane, a State Police. patrol car, and Giglio's truck took about three hours to complete the trip, which was made Wednesday. Averaging about 10 miles an hour, they paraded through Rockville center, Collins Green, South Willington, Merrill, Mansfield Depot, then on to North Coventry and finally to Onserve the where his face is in

Lodge was not expected to sub-mit immediately any proposal for specific action by the Security Council. Associates said he was prepared to consider appropriate measures as the debate progressed. The initial discussion was ex-pected to boil down mostly to an exchange between the United States and Russia. Other delegates have indicated privately that they cannot see what good the Council debate can accomplish. Accounts Contradictory The difficulty faced by the Coun-ell stems from the contradictory incounts of the incident given by the two powers.
