There is something almost vital about the way American military authorities kept writing for the Communist world to assist the theory of air power they themselves have adopted, and these same American authorities derive a curious brand of satisfaction from indications that, by producing atomic and hydrogen bombs and long range missiles obviously designed to be able to deliver them, the Russians are at least preparing for tactics they have hitherto refused to demonstrate.

They have hitherto refused to demonstrate. The tactics the Communists have so far refused to adopt in actual practice are the tactics of using bombers in offensive fashion against civilian targets.

In the Korean war, the Communists used air power only for defensive purposes. Their fighters fought our fighters and our bombers. They put no bombs over our lines, or over the obvious targets behind our lines.

What made this still more unpleasant was the fact that, without using one of the main tactics of modern war, the Communists were still able to hold their own in Korea.

Once again, in Indo-China, the Communists refrained from using offensive air power. Perhaps that was because of the nature of the war, which did not make air power seem very decisive in any case.

Now, in the little war being fought over Quemoy, the Chinese Nationalists are using bombing tactics as they harass the Chinese Communists, and boast of dropping bombs on the Communists.

But, if they follow their previous code, the Communists still will use air power only to defend themselves against bombing by others, and not use it offensively themselves.

By that code, if they stick to it, the Communists would never, of course, drop an atomic bomb on anybody. And that, of course, is where the possible abandonment of the code does loom in present Communist planning.

Practically every member of the western community is a nationalist in his heart, that colonialism is dead. And, from time to time, all these nations will join in high-sounding declarations, like that just signed at Manila, which in effect proclaim that colonialism is dead.

Yet, the American people had sense enough to vote for this middle-of-the-road, and the good presumption is that, having voted for it, they also have sense enough to evaluate it and recognize it when they get it.
