

ILA President William V. Bradley, and other top union officials who attended the mediation meeting were reported to have promised to recommend quick approval of the agreement. Waterfront observers viewed formal endorsement of the agreement as virtually certain.

Although Bradley said long-shoremen would continue on strike until the 170-man wage scale committee acts, other union officials said some men would probably go back at the start of the regular work day.

The strike caught 71 ships in port and idled docks all along the 350-mile waterfront, biggest and busiest in the world. It came on short notice yesterday and demonstrated the resurgent power of the ILA after a year of bitter but successful struggle to retain its long control of dock labor.

Specifically at issue was the union's demand for immediate payment of an hourly 8-cent wage increase and a two-cent boost in welfare benefits, both retroactive to Oct. 1, 1953. Although the employers offered to pay the wage raise as demanded and the welfare increase back to last April 1, they balked st any payment unless coupled with a contract covering the next two years.
