> TRAVELS FOR A DONKEY By Joseph P. Lyford -DEMOCRATIC CANDIDATE FOR CONGRESSMAN-AT-LARGE

WESTPORT - This three month journey nears its end. It has carried me through more than a hundred towns and cities. Now, cautiously, a few conclusions. I HAVE FOUND that most of our people do not have a personal sense of contact with their government. They are not bitter about this; they simply do not expect it.

They are surprised at the appearance of a politician among them. He is a curious kind of outsider, sometimes welcome, sometimes suspect. But, finally, the politician is only a passing phenomenon — to be seen once, perhaps, but surely nor again. The man at the factory gate has seen several politicians in his time, but all before November. Get help from a Congressman? he asks. If you have influence, And influence is something the other fellow has, not me. IT HAS BEEN A QUIET CAMPAIGN, but the silence of people is no measure of their anxieties. The working man who sees his factory begin to slow down will wait a while before he brings the subject up at his own table. In the coun-try upriver from New London, she farmer is quier, too, and counts his money slowly, because there is less to count. He looks around at his cows and chickens

and hopes for a change in the economic weather, just like his city neighbor, OTHER PEOPLE WHO DO NOT TALK about their trouble are the children. OTHer PEOPLE WHO DO NOT TALK about their trouble are the children. This is because they are small and do not understand what is happening to them in many of their achools. Only the teacher and the parent know the meaning of the exhaustion and bewilderment and confusion of children in overcrowded classrooms, how these things destroy the chance to learn and the effort to educate. This is a problem that gets up with the family in the morn-ing and keeps it swake at night.

THERE IS A FINAL ANXLETY, I found, which was almost never voiced. Yet I think that subconsciously it is the deepest concern of all — perhaps this is why people milled so little about it. It is an anxiety in the musturcom shape of an enormous and unbelievable cloud. The shadow of this cloud lies across every home in our land.

WE MUST FACE THE BOMB the way we would face all the other problems that crowed around us. We must not be helpless before it as if it were an angry god. We cannot let the mind and spirit fail in argument against it. Just as there is a way to put every hand to useful work, and to give every child an equal chance to learn and grow, there is a way to peace in a world of freedom. The send to one is the read to all.
