Household Hints

You can make a quick sauce for plain cake or cottage pudding by heating a cup of apricot preserves with a little lemon rind and lemon juice. Top the dessert with whipped cream or vanilla ice cream. This amount of sauce will make enough for four servings of cake or pudding. The sauce may also be used over baked custard.

Chef's trick: Garnish steak chops with water cress and Radish Fans. To make the fans, cut the roots away from the radishes but leave about one inch of their green tops. Then cut thin slices crosswise almost through the radish. Let the radishes stand in ice water in the refrigerator so they will spread out like a fan.

Try this casserole if you have roast beef leftover. Cut the meat into two-inch squares and mix it with drained canned tomatoes and drained whole-kernel corn. Add a little basil and allspice and salt and pepper to taste. Bake, covered, in a moderate oven until hot.

Want to try your hand at baking French eclairs? Use a standard recipe for cream puffs and drop the batter by spoonfuls onto a baking sheet. Then with small knife or spatula, shape the batter into oblongs that are about four inches long and one inch wide. Make sure the eclairs are at least two inches apart from each other to allow for expansion during baking.






