By THE ASSOCIATED PRESS Connecticut's ticket splitting electorate replaced its Republican governor with a Democrat in a tight election yesterday, but left unchanged the state's congressional House lineup of five Republicans and one Democrat.

Complete unofficial returns gave the governorship to former U. S. Rep. Abraham A. Ribicoff by about 3,000 votes. Ribicoff, 44-year-old lawyer and the first Jew ever to win the governorship, beat down the reelection bid of Gov. John Lodge in a contest that was in doubt almost until the last of nearly 940,000 votes had been counted. The unofficial returns from the 169 towns gave Ribicoff

463,530 and Lodge 460,735.
Together, with the five House sents. Republicans retained control of all state offices below the governor.
