Bonn Physicists Win Shortly before Pauling was picked, the academy awarded the 1854 physics prize jointly to two West German scientists who helped lay the foundation of modern nuclear physics.
They are Dr. Max Born, 73, s

former professor at the universi-ties of Goettingen, Cambridge and Edinburgh, now living in retire-ment at Bad Pyrmont, Germany, and Prof. Walther Bothe, 63, of the dax Planck Institute at Heide Academy said Born was

"for his fundamental honored "for his fundamental works in quantum mechanics, especially his statistical interpretation of wave function." Born's reduction to formulae of the function has enabled scientists to calculate various states of the atom.

It said Bothe received the other half of the prize for his "coincidence method" in the atudy of cosmic radiation "and the discoveries he made with it." From his findings was developed a major precision instrument enabling scientists to measure time spaces within the atom of less than a within the atom of less than a

within the atom of less than a billionth of a second.

The Nobel awards, established by the will of the late Alfred Nobel, Swedish inventor of dynamite, include a gold medal and a cash prize in each category. The money award this year amounts to 181,-646 krona, about \$35,000.

Stockholm's Caroline Institute of Medicine awarded the medicine and physiology prize Oct. 21 to three American scientists—Dr. John F. Enders of the Harvard Medical School, Dr. Thomas H. Weller of the Harvard School of Public Health, and Dr. Frederick C. Robbins of Western Reserve Medical School in Cleveland—fordiscovering new weapons in the discovering new weapons in the ight against polic. A week later, the Royal Swed ish Academy of Literature gave the award in its field to American novelist Ernest Hemingway. An-nouncement was made previously that the Nobel peace award would

Prof. Arne Tiselius, vice president of the Nobel Foundation and himself a former chemistry prize-winner, termed Pauling's achieve ments "a major contribution to protein chemistry, a field where the alightest theoretical advance can have important consequences in explaining the nature of diseases and bringing a cure for them." Proteins are the most compli-cated of all chemical compounds. Their molecules usually consist of tens of thousands of atoms. Paul-ing's findings enabled him to predict the place of atoms in the structure of protein molecules an the distance between the atoms. He also was able to construct models of such molecules.

Pauling, 53, has been under fire several times in recent years for alleged Communist affiliations, a charge he has stoutly denied. He was smong 30 scientists and educators identified by former Communist Louis Budenz as onetime members of the party. Paulied
