Officers had believed the man was in the area since both his automobile and his home were located. Another police officer said Fowler owns a boat he used on Lake Mead.

Police said Fowler had no previous criminal record but had been drinking heavily since the divorce. At that time his wife was given the family home and also the boy's story with the stipulation that Fowler be allowed to work three days a week in an apartment at the rate of \$100 a month.

The Vatican reported the Pope was continuing to improve from his grave illness. Besides taking several steps today he was carried to an easy chair and remained there five minutes while his bed was removed. It was his first time out of bed since his collapse last Thursday.

An authoritative source said the Pontiff's doctor, Riccardo Galeazzi-Lati, plans to fall his patient daily, gradually increasing the number of steps, as a precaution against ill effects from prolonged immobility.

At noon the Vatican announced that the Pope's recovery continues. Transmitters over Rome last night disturbed the Pope's rest, but they were bright and sunny for the final celebrations of the year, honoring the Virgin Mary.

A television set installed in his bedroom brought the Pope in company of the street celebrations and church services in honor of the Virgin.

The Pope attended this morning from his bed in celebration of the feast of the Virgin, St. Elizabeth, the German Jesuit who is chief of his personal secretariat.

Today was an important one for the Pontiff, who inaugurated the Marian Year just a year ago in honor of the Virgin and commemorated the centenary of the Dogma of Her Immaculate Conception. The Pope established the Roman Catholic faith the belief that Mary had no original sin and was born without sin.

Roman Catholics throughout the world have been holding special services and processions in honor of the Virgin.

The Pope approved from his bed yesterday a decree for the causes of canonization and canonization of Pope Pius IX, who proclaimed the Dogma 100 years ago.

The Pope had deigned to participate in the final ceremony of the year-long observance today.
