### Madrid Reported Favoring Lodge

Hartford, Dec. 14 (AP)—Reports that Gov. John Lodge has been cleared by the Spanish government for appointment as U. S. Ambassador to Madrid were confirmed today by high administration sources in Washington.

It was said that President Eisenhower probably will send Lodge's appointment to the Senate for confirmation in a few weeks.

At the White House, a spokesman said, however: "We've been told nothing about it yet."

The governor's nomination for the \$20,000-a-year post apparently will come at the conclusion of his four-year term as Connecticut's chief executive and after the new Congress, under Democratic control, begins its work.

There were no indications at this point that the Lodge nomination will be opposed, although hearings are anticipated. Lodge will succeed careerist James Dunn in Spain.

There was some opposition to the appointment of the last former Connecticut Governor appointed to the foreign service. Eventually, however, Democratic Chief Justice Warren was confirmed and sent to India, where he served until after President Eisenhower's inauguration.
