New Probe Opens On Triple Slaying

Paris, Dec. 15 (AP)—French police launched a new investigation today into the triple murder of British food expert Sir Jack Drummond, his wife and daughter.

The new inquiry was ordered yesterday by the French Justice Ministry after Gaston Dominici, a 70-year-old farmer convicted of the Aug. 4, 1952 slaying, gave fresh testimony on his jail cell at Marseilles to court officials.

There was no official word on what the old man said but the investigation could lead to a new trial for Dominici, who was sentenced Nov. 26 to die on the guillotine.

Drummond, his wife, and their 10-year-old daughter were killed while camping on the Dominici farm in the Alpine foothills of Southern France.

After 15 months of police investigation, Dominici was accused of the murders by two of his sons. He confessed and renounced the crimes for police. Then he went back on his confession. Permitted out of his cell in Dijon, he sent off a peasant protest he was innocent the day after he was granted the post had been vacant since the death of Sigmond A. Castre last March.

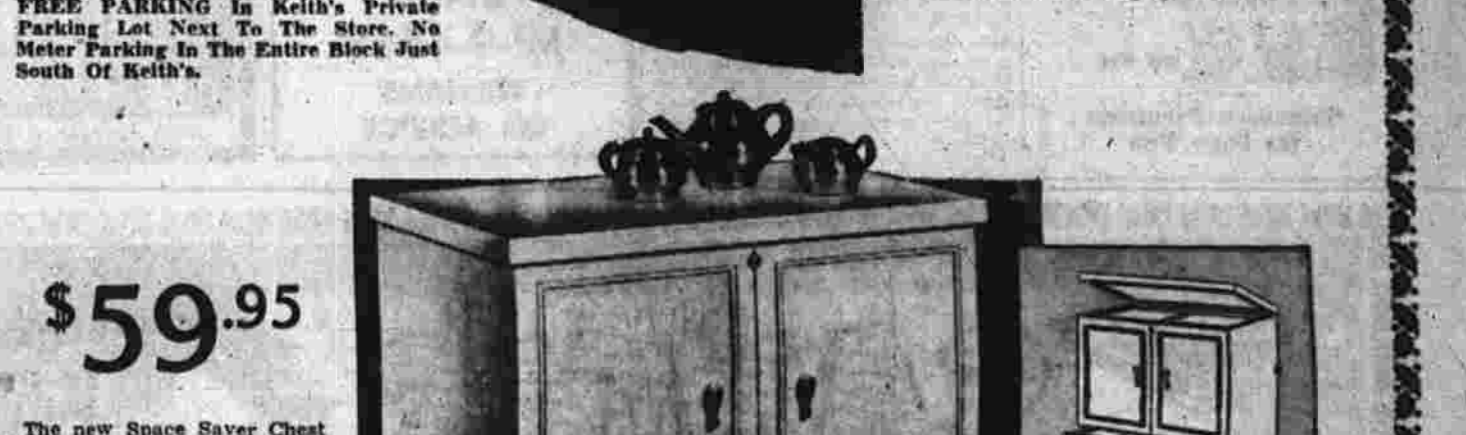

Economist Hits Textile Tariff Cut as Unjust

Washington, Dec. 15. (AP)—A Harvard economist, Seymour R. Harris, asserted yesterday a reduction in tariffs on textiles is unjustifiable.

Summarizing the opposition of New England's textile manufacturers to possible tariff cuts, Harris, in testimony before the U. S. Tariff Commission and the Committee for Reciprocity Information, said:

"An administrative agency could defend tariff relaxation for an industry which, if it continued to lose the average number of jobs of the last three years, would be gone in 15 years, and which on the same basis would disappear from New England within eight years."

Tariff Set for February

The government has announced its intention to discuss tariff concessions with Japan at Geneva, Switzerland, in February. Textile tariffs are scheduled to be considered.

Textiles constitute a major portion of the New England economy. But, with prices of Japanese textiles based on an average wage of 11.9 cents an hour, New England mills, with an average wage of \$1.45 an hour find it impossible to compete with the Japanese unless tariffs offset the difference, Harris said.

Government interference with the free market, he said, had "gravely injured New England's competitive position." He cited, as an example, federal agricultural and tax policies.

But New England

"It would be the height of folly," Harris contended, "for the government now to revert to free market principles through tariff cuts when interference with the free market has hurt New England."

"The government should look at overall policies," he said. Harris said "all will admit" that Japan's ailments "are many and deep."

He cited the country's loss of the Chinese market, formerly accounting for about one-half of her exports, the destruction of factories in World War II, unwise investment policies, the large money and wage inflation not offset by a corresponding depreciation of the yen, the abandonment of the United States aid, the loss of territory with corresponding losses of export potential and increased need of food imports. "The loss of dollar income associated with reduced shipping and fishing industries and the dismantling of western Europe to open its markets to Japan.

"In the light of these fundamental changes," he said, "it is not likely that tariff concessions at the expense of one of the United States' major export industries (textiles) is going to contribute in any important way toward the solution of Japan's dollar problems."

J. William Belanger, a labor member of the New England Textile Committee, said that even under present tariff rates, textile products are being imported in increasing quantities while domestic industry suffers from unemployment.

Auto Industry Gets Rough In Hot Sales Competition

By DOUGLAS LARSEN
DETROIT (REAP)—Thomas H. Keating is the genial, white-haired boss of Chevrolet, who came up the tough sales route. He laughs off questions like this: "Is it true that the new eight-cylinder Chevy engine has been set in the chassis in such a way as to make it easy for mechanics to get at because you expect a lot of trouble from the engine?" "Not any truer than last year's rumor that the new Buick broke the new windshield," he quips. "Only worry I have about this engine is putting enough for our production line," he adds. This million-dollar story about the Chevy engine, making the rounds, is typical of the rough, tough tactics stemming from the intense competition in this critical year for the automotive industry. Potential car buyers have been to be amazed as never before in history by everything from the super-slick techniques devised by the industry's top sales talent this year, to the cut-throat schemes of the shady dealers. Automobile bootlegging is the sale of new cars by unauthorized dealers who get them in various ways. The car makers and their dealers around the country are already screaming about the mushrooming of bootlegging since the new models have been introduced. "I can confirm the revival of bootlegging," says General Motors President Harpur W. Currier, "and I expect it to continue because we have been unable to do anything that would curb or extinguish it." An attempt to reduce it by equalizing freight rates, thereby limiting the profit on picking up a car in Detroit and driving it to a distant market, had had only minor effect, but reports repeat. Bootlegged cars are used as come-ons on some outdoor car lots. They're frequently sold far above list price to naive customers. The practice is considered a black-eye to the trade generally. The danger of bootlegging to the customer, in addition to the chance of paying an excessive price, is getting a car not properly prepared for general use. The buyer can end up with hundreds of dollars worth of repair bills on a brand new car. Even in doing business with legitimate dealers this year, the customer is going to have to keep his wits about him to get the car he wants and needs at the right price. For the past months Ford, Chevy, and Chrysler salesmen around the country, for instance, have been shown slide and training films of new sales approaches and techniques. Horwopow is another item the customer should investigate if it is of special importance to him. Most of the engineers of the car firms admit privately that a lot of the new Horwopow claims for engines this year are somewhat exaggerated. Soviet Hints Japs Can Trade With Reds, Keep Ties to U.S.

Japan, without Japan breaking with the West.

2. The Communist powers are also willing to negotiate economic relations with Japan.

3. The Soviet-Red China alliance is not aimed at Japan, but is only a defense against aggression.

Until now, the Communist powers have had "no-man's-land" status, still "semi-occupied" and "trapped" on by the United States—and hence unable to conclude a truce treaty with the Red nation.

The Oct. 11 joint statement by the Reds was a blast against American policy in Japan and a hopeful hint for the Japanese to start "freeing themselves from dependence on a foreign power," as a first step toward "normal relations."

It nowhere repudiated earlier Communist refusals to sign a peace treaty with Japan because of her ties with America.

The September 1954 statement was an appeal for normal relations with Japan—but one couched in generalities open to many interpretations.

Japan's new administration under Prime Minister Ichiro Hirota and Foreign Minister Shigenobu Tamemitsu has taken liberal stand toward negotiation with the Reds than former Premier Shigeru Yoshida, who resigned last week.

"Some difficulties lie ahead in matters," Yoshida added, "but they are not at all insurmountable."

If there are persons who think they are insurmountable, they are only unwilling to surmount the difficulties.

The recent Communist statements, he said, "make it clear that Russia and Red China are prepared to carry out measures for an adjustment of diplomatic relations with Japan" and the two countries "would give perfect support to Japan if she wants to conclude diplomatic and economic relations with them."

Freezing the meat at five degrees Fahrenheit for 20 days also kills the parasites but possibly this is not a satisfactory measure as it has accumulated 2,670 points.

The latest conference on trichinosis developed a great many recommendations for the attack on this disease. Since we know now this disease can be controlled and indeed eliminated, these measures should be followed with great vigor. All of us can help.

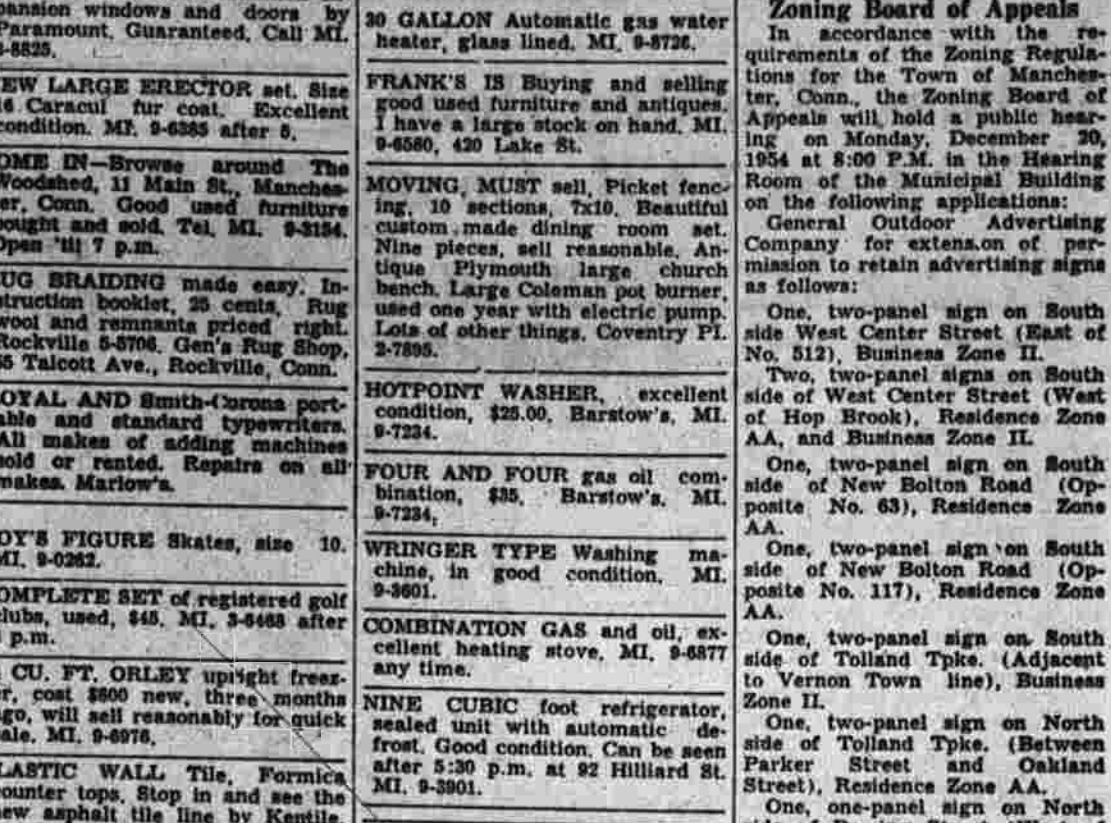

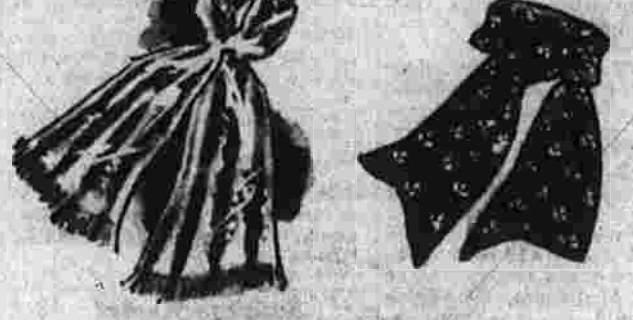
