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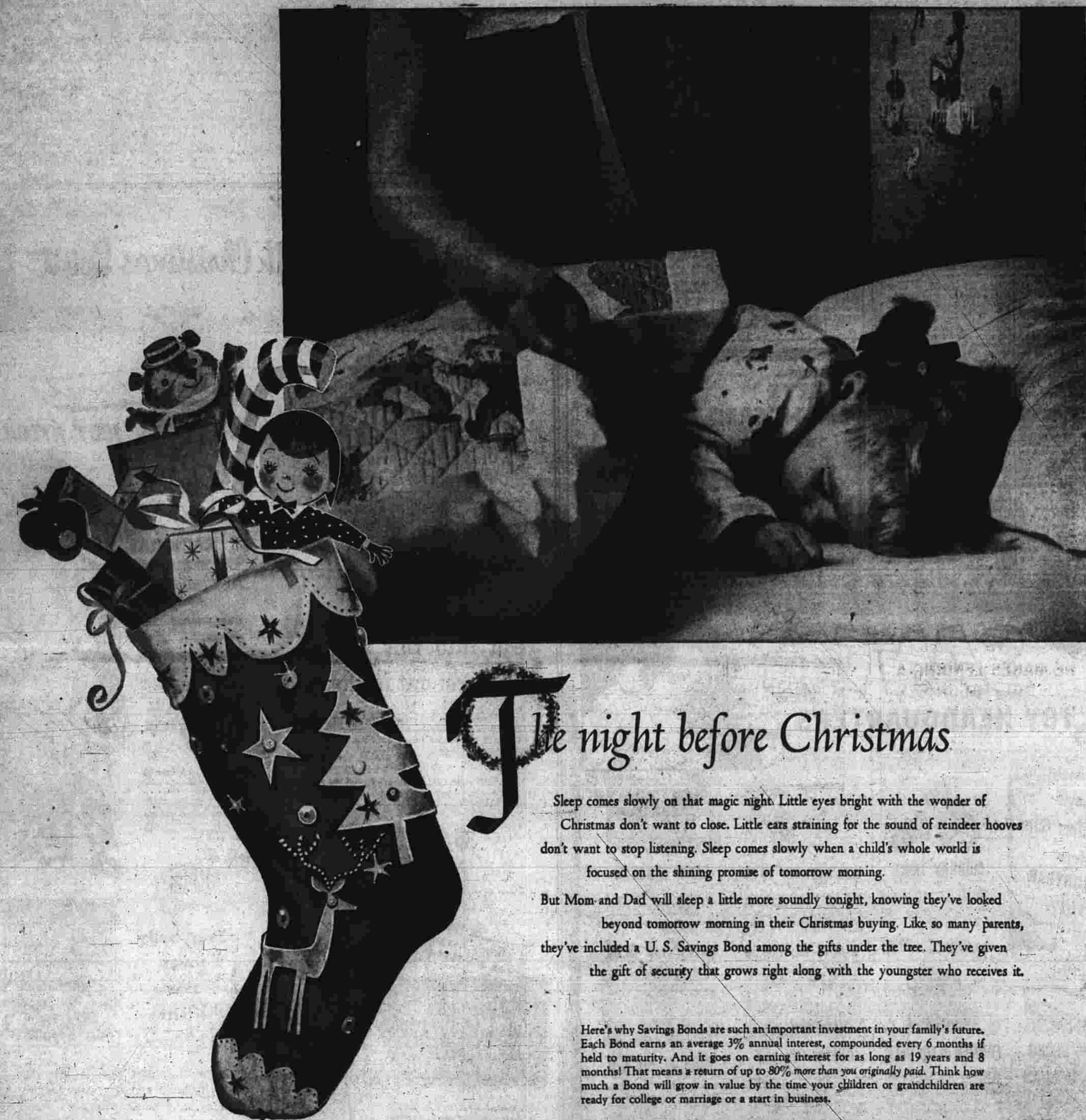

### Life in Jail For Murderer

#### Convict Nebraska Man For Killing Nephew of The Rev. Carl E. Olson

A 23-year-old Nebraska hold-up man has been found guilty in Holbrook, Neb., of first-degree murder in the death of a nephew of the Rev. Carl Olson, pastor of Emanuel Lutheran Church here.

The Associated Press reports that a district court jury of 12 men early Saturday directed that Fred Overton, of Hastings, Neb., be imprisoned for life for the murder of Leland Erickson, 22, of Holbrook, who was killed during a hold-up attempt at a small farm near Holdrege on Oct. 2.

Erickson was the son of Mrs. Carl Erickson, the Rev. Mr. Olson's sister. The Ericksons, who have one other son, live on a farm in Holdrege. Mrs. Erickson visited in Manchester three years ago.

Under Nebraska law, Judge Edmund Nus must follow the jury's decision and sentence Overton to life imprisonment, although the prosecution had asked the death penalty. Overton was charged with shooting Erickson after the latter grappled with him when Overton was attempting to hold up the home of a family named Gugie.

According to reports of the shooting, Erickson attempted to rush Overton after Erickson took the third light of a match when Overton permitted the three men he was holding at gunpoint to smoke.

In the confusion that followed, Overton fired shots that hit Paul and Earl Gugie. Their wounds, however, were not serious enough to stop them from reaching Overton and wrestling him to the floor.

Then Carl Gugie rushed into the parlor from another room in the farm home and held Overton under guard with a shotgun until the sheriff arrived.

The Associated Press reported that the defense had pictured Overton as the product of a broken home in early childhood.

parently does not give the government unlimited right to determine how much compensation to pay when acquiring land for reform and nationalization.

Further, Deshmukh emphasized the government is still anxious for private investment and has no intention of regulating the amount of profits foreign investors may take out of the country.

Nehru and Deshmukh gave new emphasis to their concept of a "mixed economy" with state enterprise in the primary role and private industry in a secondary role, as an economic controversy raged through India.

The dispute was sparked a month ago when Nehru and his ministers indicated they were determined to give effect to their frequent promise to create a Socialist state.

The proposed constitutional amendment followed a recent court ruling requiring the government to pay the market value when it acquires property for national economic development. The government is said to believe the national interests require it shall not be expected to give full market value.

The proposed amendment ap-

parently avoids setting a rate of compensation but in effect would allow the state to gain control of private industry temporarily without paying anything "in order to secure better management."

Deshmukh emphasized the government "stands by" its 6-year-old economic policy reserving control of certain basic industries to the state. The chief objective, he declared, is to create employment—at least two million new jobs every year.

In order to create these jobs, Deshmukh continued, India needs private and government investment totaling two billion dollars annually.

Of the plan to nationalize the imperial bank, Deshmukh insisted other commercial banks would not be involved and that "this is not a doctrinaire plunge into nationalization."

### Girl Quits Hospital After Fatal Crash

Port Chester, N. Y., Dec. 20 (AP)—An 18-year-old Springfield, Ill., girl, who walked away from a plane crash Saturday in which the pilot and co-pilot were killed, expected to be on her way home today.

Miss Lillian Lanphier suffered only minor cuts and bruises in the crash. She was admitted to United Hospital here for a checkup and was to remain until today as a precaution.

The plane, a two-engine Lockheed, belonged to the Serrano Electric Co. of Springfield, headed by Charles Lanphier, the girl's father. It crashed about a mile from nearby Armonk Airport, where Lanphier was waiting to board it, crashing to death O. R. Armstrong of Springfield, the pilot, and Chester High of Danville, Ill., the co-pilot.

The plane picked up Miss Lanphier at the Grotton Airport, Conn., to take her home for Christmas vacation. She attends the Connecticut College at New London.

Lanphier, who had been visiting a sister and brother-in-law, Mr.

Sheppard Jury Continuing Deliberations in Fifth Day

Cleveland, Dec. 21 (AP)—The Sheppard murder trial jury ended today's morning session still wordless, but hope persisted in the courtroom that this will be "V-Day"—the day of the verdict.

Although jurors gave no sign again, when they appeared in the courtroom prior to being excused for lunch, optimism continued for a decision today in the draw-out trial.

They are now in the fifth consecutive day of deliberations. Dr. Samuel H. Sheppard, the accused man, stands charged with first degree murder in the slaying of his wife, Marilyn, 31, last July 4.

Sheppard returned from lunch at 1:30 p. m. The strange case, which has excited intense controversy in Cleveland, was given to the jury during the afternoon session.
