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High good argument which is emphasized in the presentation of this time is that it would correct present glaring inequalities in the obligations placed upon individual American citizens.

These inequalities are obvious. Some are called to military service by the draft, and some are not. In case of national emergency, as in Korea, our first recourse had to be to men who had already fought in one war and who, by speaking, should not have been called upon to fight in another war until the list of those who had not previously served had been exhausted.

So the Eisenhower administration's argument is that we must do something to bring our military away from the perpetuation of such inequality and such injustice. All Americans, it argues, should bear equal obligations to be prepared for the defense of the country. And if the same were centered on this point alone, we could dispute the administration's argument.

This good argument is being used, however, in favor of something which, however modified, amounts to permanent peace time conscription. It happens to be a rather attractive form of conscription which is offered, with some youths offered a relatively short time of obligatory training, to be followed by a long reserve status, and with other youths to serve longer, but to be retained in reserve status for a shorter period of time.

Though in the high level argument for equality of obligation with the sugar-coating heavy on the particular form of conscription which is offered, and once again it becomes hard to dispute the administration's argument.

At first, as we contemplated the news that he had succeeded in purchasing 25 old Mustang fighter planes from Sweden, we thought this amounted to something like comic opera. But to discover the August and influential New York Times claiming that this purchase "will completely distort the already unbalanced power picture in Central America" in the New York Times seems to think that we should be just as vigorous and militant about this possible acquisition of 25 fighter planes by Nicaragua as we once were about the shipment of Communist arms and munitions to Guatemala.

It points out, with some logic, that we are often accused of being more concerned with one kind of dictatorship, and one kind of aggression, than another. It suggests that we ought not to give any kind of dictatorship, or aggression, the same kind of attention. This is a high-minded point, but what it deteriorates into is the contention that we ought to be higher than the temporary price that kind of dictatorship may be. Our modern technique, no matter what kind of dictatorship may be, is to pay for not interfering. We ought to be consistent, true. But the consistency which would serve us best, in the long run, is a consistency of non-interference, in the role of a great sole power, in the affairs of our neighbors.

This obvious plot to get these violent conclusions, prepared by violent and distorted minds, into some official form, as the official report of an official committee, so that, for years to come, they may be quoted and used as an official verdict against the various foundations, like the Ford Rockefeller, and Ford foundations, whenever and wherever they try to carry on their work.

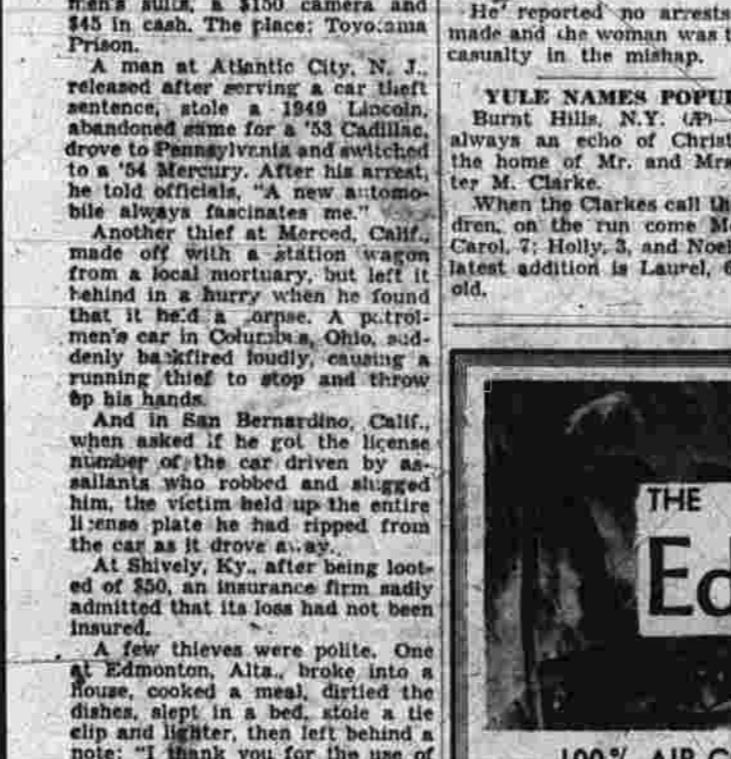
