The early release program is part of the pian to speed up the process of frimming down the Army. The new program is simed to cut off the rolls by June 73,000 more men than previously planned, leaving a force of 1,100,000 at the end of that month.

Much of the total reduction in strength the monthly call is expected to con-tinue at least through next June. The Army said in connection with the planned early release of reservists that the program will not include officers of the wom-
