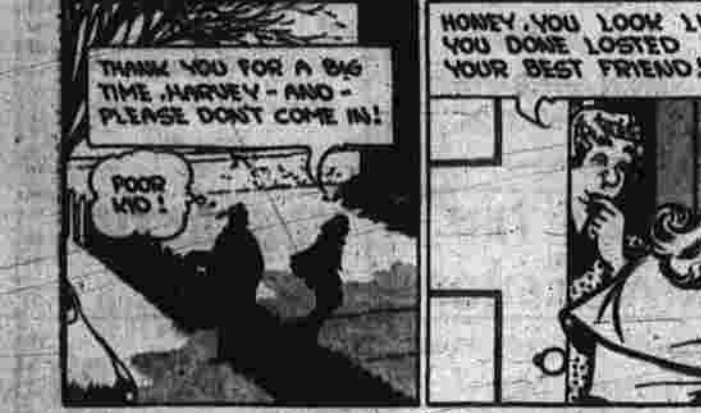

Prices Guilty of Neglect, Get Jail Term, Probation

Charles J. Price, 22, of Troy, N. Y., and his wife, Leatrice, 21, of Hartford, were each given six months in jail for Town Court this morning on charges of causing the delinquency or dependency of children under 16. Mrs. Price's sentence was suspended and Price's case will be further investigated after he serves 30 days of the sentence. Mrs. Price was placed on probation for a year.

Boundary Dispute Settled by Court
