Washington, Jan. 8 (AP)—The Democratic National Committee has given Democratic congressmen a message of "critique" assailing some of the proposals and claims in President Eisenhower's State of the Union Message.

The committee report, prepared by the Democratic Research Staff, attacked the President's proposals to scale down tariff barriers for expanded world trade.

The real question is not the content of the Eisenhower recommendations, but whether the President is light for the American people, or opposition, instead of support, as he did in 1952.

The analysis was prepared by the committee's research staff under the leadership of William Butler.
