At the outset of the news conference the President remarked with a smile that he had not had an opportunity to wish newsmen a happy New Year and wanted to do so.

Then he took brief note of the dispute between Great Britain and Nicaragua, saying that a commission picked by the Organization of American States had left early this morning for the scene of the trouble to make an investigation. Stassen added he would have no further comment pending the outcome of that inquiry.

The first question put to the President dealt with the Ladejnsky case and a good half of the 30-minute news conference was taken up by subsequent discussion of that matter.

Northampton, Mass., Jan. 12.—Not only is communication, but also understanding and educational development of deaf children, is being advanced by a new technique of teaching them to cope with life in a world of sound will be depicted in a color film to be made at Clarke School for the Deaf for nationwide distribution.

Production of "Susan's Wonderful Adventure," as the movie is titled, began last weekend at the 87-year-old school which pioneered in teaching the deaf to speak.

Camera crews from the Audubon Center at Syracuse University, Syracuse, N. Y., will be here for approximately six weeks working in classrooms and dormitory. Late spring release of the film is expected by the director, Paul R. Lawrence of the deaf.

4-Year-Old is Star
Star of the show will be 4-year-old Susan Phillips, daughter of Mrs. Henry Phillips of Northampton, Mass. Blonde, blue-eyed and buxom, Susan entered Clarke last September in a primary class of 15.

Included in the film's "cast" will be other youngsters drawn from the school's 144 students and representatives of its 101 teachers and staff.

Public ignorance of the full significance of deafness is the worst problem faced by persons who are deaf, says George T. Pratt, principal of Clarke.

"To reach and inform the largest possible audience with a dramatic, factual, film-narrative impact, the film is being taken to television length in hopes of utilizing that mass medium.

Clarke is one of five centers at which Massachusetts subsidizes training of deaf children. Its students are from many states and nations.

"Susan's wonderful adventure" will trace steps taken at Clarke to equip deaf youngsters for an effective, constructive role in the world of the hearing. The audience will be taken into dormitories and classrooms of the lower, middle and upper divisions of the school and will see children at all play.

Keystones of the Clarke system is training in speech as a primary tool of communication. Susan and her classmates will be drilled constantly in the arts of talking and hearing.

They must learn to speak so that the hearing can understand them and to "hear" through their eyes as well as mastering the full range of subjects offered in public school.

Formation of sounds and words is learned by the hearing child through imitation of parents, later other community contacts, Pratt explains.

Born deaf, a child lacks any conception of sound, says Pratt. The handicap thus becomes a barrier
