Rockville-Vernon High School Sketch Shown, Site Still Remains Question

Rockville, Jan. 21 (Special)—A rough preliminary sketch of the proposed new high school was inspected by the High School Building Committee at its meeting last evening.

S. F. Jeter, Jr. and Arthur H. Cook of the firm of architects, S. F. Cook told the Committee the plans were most general and that the next step to be taken is breaking down the areas into departments and separate units. This will be done following consultation with department heads at the High School to ascertain the amount of space necessary, particularly in the shop areas. Some 6,000 square feet of space has been allotted for these departments.

The architects also suggested that one part of the proposed building be two stories, with the remaining portion being one story. The two-story portion would contain the gymnasium and the biology classrooms. One feature being planned is to have the gymnasium and auditorium with entrances directly adjacent from the school proper so that the remainder of the school could be shut off, and both the gymnasium and auditorium used for the town people as desired. It was suggested that the office and business administration facilities be located in the center, possibly to open upon the street.

Cook said that the architects have a definite plan to submit in about three weeks would have a more definite plan to submit.

Pigson recommended that the location of the new school be approved by the town meeting on July 1, if the wishes of the Democratic Party Committee are carried out. He reported that, since Oct. 1, he has received 200 calls from families of the town.

The fundamental thing to remember in these, and other types of income that must be reported, is that you are required by law to report the total, even though part may be the case with your dividends or retirement income. You may be able to exclude all or part of it from your taxable income.

The new tax law's major change in the "other income" field concerns prizes and awards, and scholarships and fellowships.

The old law was very specific about what prizes and awards were or were not taxable. The revenue service had made many specific rulings, ranging from the Nobel Prize (not taxable) to door prizes. The new law lightened up in effect using the taxable prize as a model for nontaxable prizes and awards.

If you win any kind of a prize or award, you must pay tax on it unless it falls within one of the categories listed below.

1. You must have been selected as the prize winner without any action by you to enter a contest or a proceeding.

2. You must not be required, as a condition to getting the prize, to render any "substantial" future services.

Even though you can meet these conditions, your prize will still be taxable if it is: "primarily in recognition of:" Religious, charitable, scientific, literary or artistic achievement.

That would appear to make most radio, TV, and other run-of-the-mill prizes taxable.

Within certain limitations, the amount of a grant (including accommodations, travel expenses and equipment of a cash allowance for them) under an scholarship this morning is tax free, when it meets these conditions:

1. It must be for the training or education of an individual, as part of his progress toward an academic degree or otherwise to further his education.

Persons who are candidates for a degree must pay tax on any part of their academic grant represented by a cash allowance.

Persons who are not candidates for a degree must pay tax on their scholarship or fellowship grant, unless it comes from a tax-exempt religious, charitable, scientific, literary, or educational organization.

The free grants to persons not candidates for a degree are limited to \$500 a month, for a maximum of 36 months.

The separate schedule D—like all separate schedules, available at the home of the Internal Revenue Service, is a complicated process of entering your capital gains or losses of gain or losses from the sale or exchange of other property. These are *not* taxable, but explanations on the back of the schedule. But this is a point where many people will want to consult a revenue agent (your bank, post office or local newspaper can tell you where to find him) and he can probably answer your queries (telephone), or a paid tax consultant.
