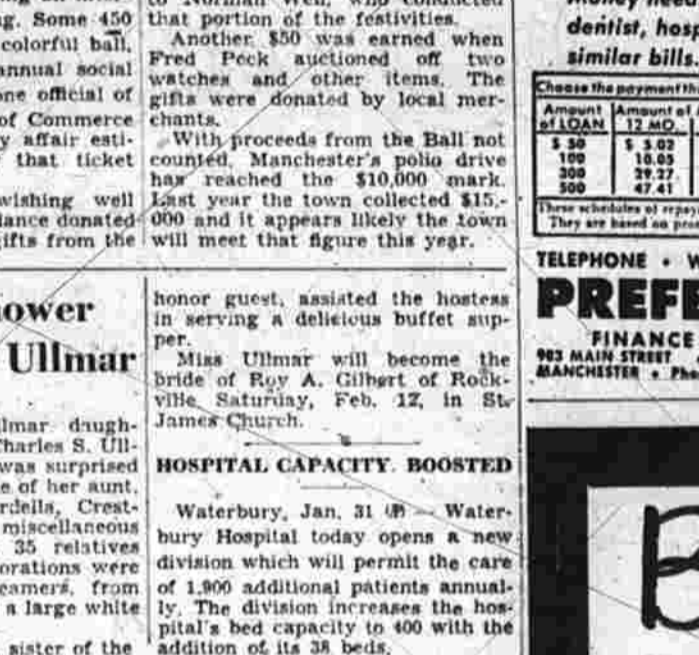

A Bias Light

A mysterious bias light has been encountered by highway crews and motorists out in Oregon. It is as elusive as flying saucers, and it is reported that it may indeed be another manifestation of benevolent supervision of our affairs from another planet. It approached one motorist, for instance, as he was trying to check the condition of his chains. He, with a suspicious mind, noted only that the light made him cast a shadow, as it hovered behind him.

Weakening The Hope

Occasionally, in a sort of back-water area in our national policy, questions are asked and issues are raised which really ought to be given some consideration in the front lines of policy too. And it is a disheartening thing, to think that while such calm study may be establishing some basic truth or principle we can ignore only at our peril, our front line policy goes blithely ahead, paying absolutely no attention to such fundamentals.

Such a back-water area study has just come from a Senate Foreign Relations subcommittee, and it discusses the eventual effect upon the United Nations of various regional security organizations.

The study noted that groups like NATO appear to possess advantages in organizing common defense against aggression, particularly Communist aggression. But then it asked the following question:

"On the other hand, will the cumulative effect of the regional arrangements in time lead to the division of the world into super-power blocs existing largely apart from one another, and wholly apart from the United Nations system?"

From all we can see in the world today, there is only one answer to this question. The United Nations is being shoved into the background by such regional pacts, and the United States is the prime shover. We have even, in our proposed treaty with Formosa, estimated that such a reference to the United Nations which we have previously incorporated in such treaties as NATO, the Organization of American States, and the Manila Pact. We are increasingly building up special and regional alliances, all professedly in aid of the protection of the peace, but all to the neglect of the one alliance which might really have a chance of protecting the peace, if the United States would only give full support and importance to it.

There are some who take the shallow and expedient view that it is very lucky for us to have such regional alliances, to guard against dangers the United States might not be strong enough to handle. The trouble is that, by such policies, the United Nations will be kept weak and made weaker. Yet the United Nations is the only real hope of the world peace today. It alone offers any possibility of a guarantee that we are not merely engaged in another cycle of power politics alliances eventually leading upon this flimsy United Nations, the answer is still the same. This is the only climax in which peace can possibly be hatched. If the United Nations seems flimsy, we had better set directly about strengthening it, for it is the only real hope of security there is.

Sheep Will Tell

The Atomic Energy Commission has a missionary team of experts out in Nevada and Utah, re-examining the conditions, but because there will be no danger from the atomic tests scheduled in the Nevada desert soon. The experts are assuming that the bombs will be exploded at a greater height from the ground, so there will be less churning up of ground dust which might become an atomic fallout.

They promise that the most extreme care will be taken to see that the weather conditions are just right to keep any contamination from traveling where it might do any harm. It's pretty much a guarantee of safety, the government's representatives are giving. But even the experts, it is said, would feel better about their present guarantee if they knew just what it was that caused the sudden death of large numbers of sheep in southern Utah, just after the nuclear tests of 1953 were concluded. The sheepmen, ever since, have suspected that something atomic may have caused the mysterious and fatal illness which hit large numbers of sheep then.

The most extensive kind of scientific and medical investigation has failed to produce any proof that the atomic tests had anything to do with the dead sheep.

At the same time, however, they have failed to find any other explanation for the sheep deaths, either. So, although the new guarantee may be iron-clad, and there be no connection whatsoever between atoms and sheep illness, it will take healthy sheep, this spring, to prove it.
