**Air Force Urged for South Asia**

Manila, Feb. 5 (AP)—An international Air Force for Southeast Asia to meet possible Communist air raids on land invasions may be submitted to the eight-nation Southeast Asia Collective Defense Treaty conference in Bangkok this month.

The proposal was made today in a resolution submitted to the Philippine House of Representatives by Rep. Narciso Babao and Bartolome Cabangbang, president of the Philippine Air Force. The resolution calls for the formation of a regional air force to meet possible Communist air raids on land invasions may be submitted to the eight-nation Southeast Asia Collective Defense Treaty conference in Bangkok this month.

The United States would be asked to take the lead in forming the international air force and in supplying jet planes and training personnel.

Countries like the Philippines, in the danger zone of a possible surprise Red attack, would furnish bases and manpower.

Wine House Support

The resolution would include support from House members. A presidential spokesman said that the president would not comment until he has had an opportunity to study the resolution.

Cabangbang said "this is a most important measure to guard the freedom of SEATO countries. We have not sounded out other SEATO signatories but we believe even Pentagon officials in Washington will approve this plan."

Deputies called the resolution a confidence issue. It was one of the biggest trials by which a Premier has been ousted since the war.

**Mendes Loses Post Over Tunisia Rule**

Paris, Feb. 5 (AP)—The French National Assembly threw Premier Mendès-France out of office today and began a search for a less stormy leader. But political observers predicted it would take a long time to find an acceptable successor.

Deputies toppled the 67-year-old Premier by a vote of 318-275 against him in a confidence vote. He was one of the biggest trials by which a Premier has been ousted since the war.

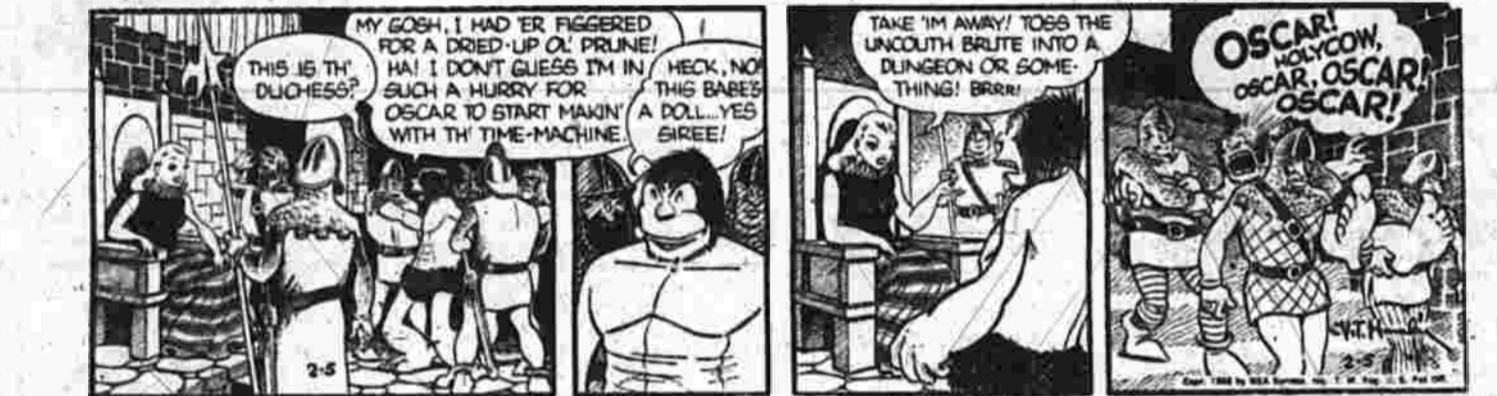
