subject to decay that the settled teeth. Thus, the investigators discovered that water which caused mottling also had a decay-preventive factor.

In 1931, H. V. Churchill, chief chemist for an aluminum company in a town which had changed its source of water, set forth the possible relation between fluoride and mottling. Water in those areas where there was mottling was found to contain fluoride in very small amounts.

But, by no means, is all the fluoride in water. In fact, it is found in many parts of the world. It is 10 times as abundant as lead and three times as abundant as copper.

Fluorine first became a concern of the dental profession early in this century at Colorado Springs, Colo. The few dentists in that town formed a dental society in 1908 and under the leadership of Dr. Frederick S. McKay, set about to find out what caused the town's children to have mottled (stained and notched) teeth.

After long research by dentists, pathologists, water engineers, public health experts and a Vitamin specialist, the proportion of one part fluoride to 1,000,000 parts water was determined to be the formula which would not cause mottling but yet would help prevent decay.

Studies were made in fluoridation of water with this formula in several communities. Each community reported a reduced rate of tooth decay. Soon, other towns and cities adopted fluoridation. Today, at least 800 communities are adding fluorides to their public water supplies.

The Formosan Tight-Rope

Every step of our current Formosan policy is precariously balanced between peace and war. We do not recall any instance in history when civilization has been placed on such a long tight-rope walking act, with such high winds blowing.

Take, for instance, the issue of our Formosan policy which is now in operation—the evacuation of the Tachen Islands.

We are trying to make this the one thing; the Formosan Chinese are trying to make it another; no one can tell which the Chinese Communists will take it to be.

We are trying to make it a peaceful gesture which, if completed without incident, will get our new Formosan policy on its first big bump. It will hand to the Chinese Communists some territory which is generally conceded to be rightfully theirs. But if the evacuation operation goes peacefully, hand it to them without bloodshed, either of their troops or their own. It will be a small and complicated world, and a North Atlantic organization is raising the membership of the Arab League.

Adams Resigns

It is a feature of the ideological conflicts of our times that the innocent can be punished as well as the guilty. Thus, out of the Army-McCarthy controversy and hearings, there was punishment in public opinion, and in loss of prestige, for those who were guilty of direct offense to the traditions of this country.

There is also punishment for those who, although basically innocent, were smeared by the process of getting at the guilty. An item of the kind of punishment now appears in the resignation of John G. Adams as general counsel for the Army. His crime was that he was an instrument of shifting Eisenhower administration policy toward McCarthy.

When the Eisenhower administration was trying to handle McCarthy through a policy of appeasement, Adams was the spearhead of that appeasement. When the Eisenhower administration finally decided that appeasement would not work, Adams became the spearhead of attack on McCarthy.

During the period of appeasement of McCarthy, Adams participated in some of the most important decisions of the administration. He was right and honorable to McCarthy. He was wrong to McCarthy.

Now he says the price for his role as an administration instrument, smeared by the appeasement he executed, his crime being that he surrendered more than he should have to the whims of a man who was right and honorable to McCarthy, but wrong to McCarthy.

Jet Pilot Hangs For 30 Minutes In Blown Chute

San Antonio, Tex., Feb. 7 (AP)—A jet pilot says he hung helplessly in his parachute more than half an hour while waiting to be rescued.

"I'm lucky to be alive," said Col. W. O. Beane yesterday—his 25th birthday.

Strange air currents kept Beane aloft 35 minutes Saturday night after he bailed out, he said. He added it was a harrowing experience to hang suspended in pitch darkness that long.

Returning to Randolph Air Force Base from Lake Abilene, Tex., Beane's T-33 jet trainer ran low on fuel. He ejected himself into the night, and the plane crashed some 20 miles north of here.

Beane said that after his chute opened unusually strong vertical drafts either held him in check or forced him upward. He bailed out at 7,000 feet—more than a mile high. Whether he was carried higher, or at what level he spent his strange half hour aloft, he could not say.

Clouds, when rain, snow and darkness, virtually blinded him, Beane said. He said he had never even seen the parachute canopy.

"He was the only time I was in because all he could see was the glowing dial of his watch—"I had nothing else to do but look at it." It was 30 minutes after he jumped before he spotted his way out of earth. He said two small lights twinkled in the distance. Later he plopped into a tree. A rancher gave him coffee. Beane suffered only scratches and bruises.

It was Beane's third emergency jump. The first was in World War II, the second in Korea. Beane, 39, was a major in the Air Force 15 years.

Major at Randolph called Beane's story "the most unusual experience I've heard of in 20 years."

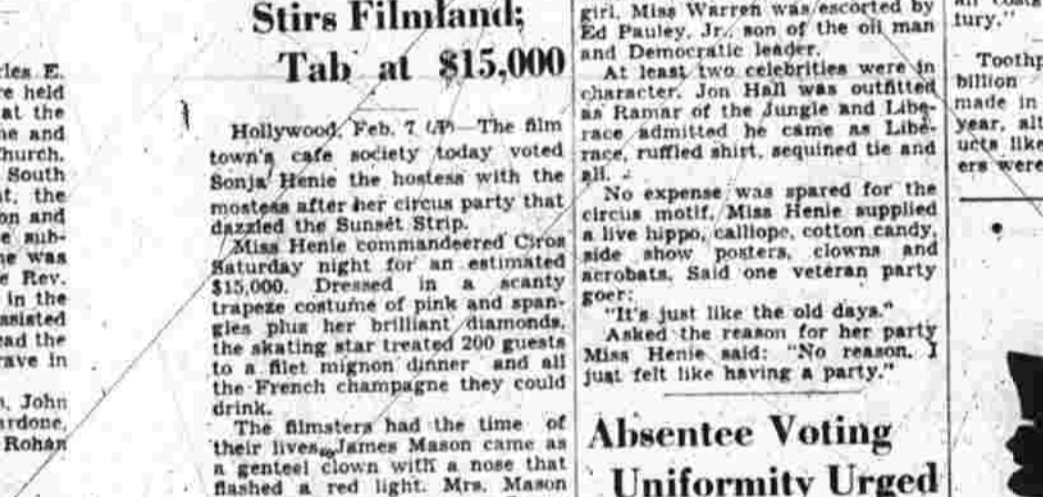

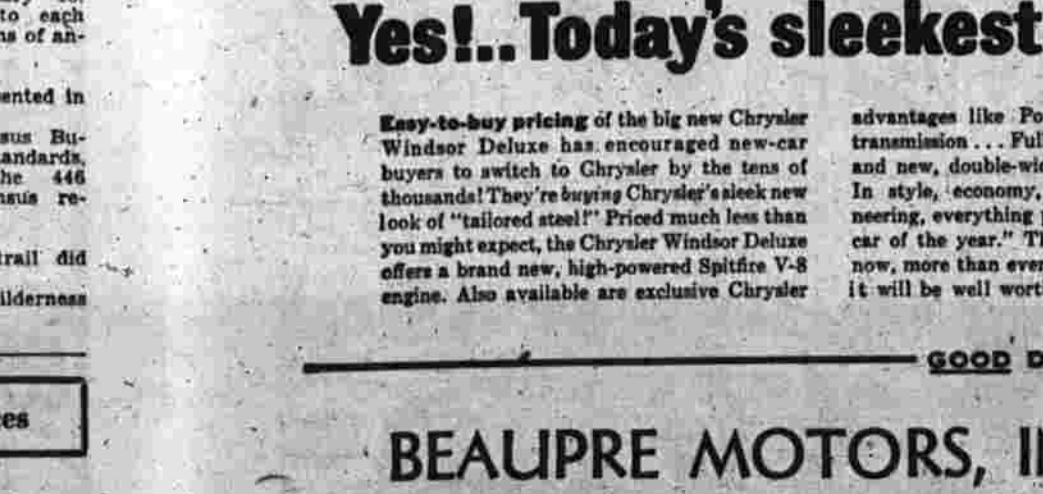

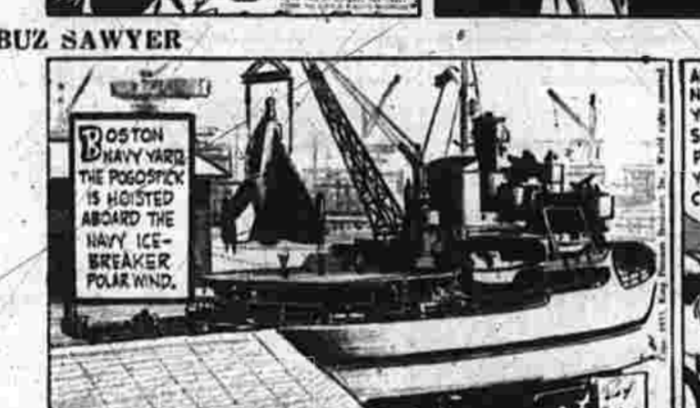
