**"Incalculable"**  
Arthur Krook, the sometimes reserved editor columnist of the New York Times, obviously felt himself somewhat warmed and moved, the other day it was in attending another of those press conferences President Eisenhower holds in the midst of world crises that he found a certain amazement of the President's crying to be written. So he went to his typewriter and produced an impressionist's sketch of the day and night, as they, they, they, attended the same press conference through one facility or another. But what they may have felt, as a vague impression, Krook put on the line, in the right words.

Here is what Krook reported: "The value to the country in these critical times of a President who doesn't scare or get furred is incalculable. Today, General Eisenhower again appeared to be such a President, in a news conference abashed with the gravity of events in the Communist world which Western intelligence is wholly unable to evaluate. And, also, though great hazards lurked in a dozen questions to him, he avoided all the pitfalls while responding with his natural civility and candor.

"On two subjects in particular," Krook continued, "he furnished an impressive exhibit of a man who keeps his balance by others under nothing like the same pressure are losing theirs. "He dealt with Marshal Zhukov, the new Soviet Minister of Defense, not all the trigger of fear-some and impending war against the United States, but he knew the personal friend who sent him 'an enormous bear rug' the last time he heard from the Marshal directly, Zhukov and he, the President said, tried and proved on the limited stage of post-war Berlin that 'even two nations can get along if they both recognize the folly of not getting along.' And that Navy plans the future of Communists abashed down in the Formosa Strait? The pilot got a little bit lost, wandered in a bad area and got hit, but the crew was saved. There has been no 'real interference' with United States supervision of the evacuation of the Tachen.

**A Policy Masters Us**  
Reports from Washington say that our high officials think that, in so far as foreign policy has anything to do with the latest

shift of power in Russia, the prospective remaining of Germany has been the influential factor. We don't know whether these high officials, who now reportedly see our policy for the re-arrangement of Germany into the policy which has motivated Russia into a seeming turn toward toughness, are inspired by their present analysis toward any basic reappraisal of the policy of re-arranging Germany. Perhaps they can see its effects toward our taking any doubt as to its wisdom, even though it might seem obvious that what may have happened is that a policy presumably designed for our security has merely operated to increase our sense of insecurity.

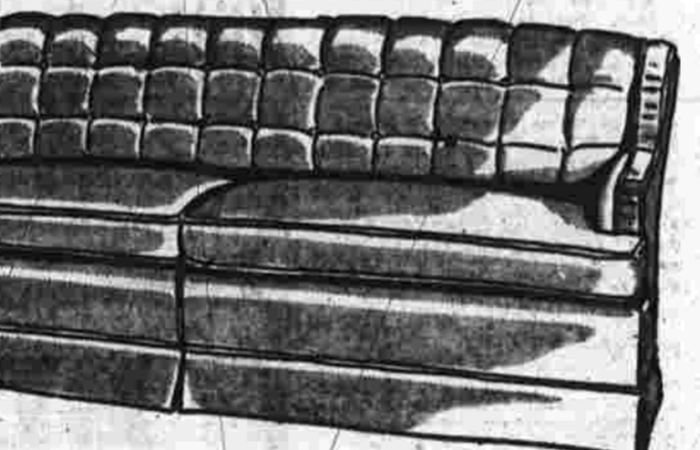

Stewart Hillman has been elected chairman of the group and John F. Champagne, secretary. Meetings are held the first Monday of each month to discuss and enlarge upon the present services wherever possible.

The scope of the group's activities will be enlarged upon after proper training and instruction classes now under consideration have been concluded. They are in a position to cooperate with police systems requiring their assistance.
