**School Building Problems**

Bolton, Feb. 22 (Special)—A good many townspeople of local school building were heard last night at the special meeting held at the home of Mrs. Pearl Jewell, which drew 150 voters. The meeting which did not adjourn until 11:30 p. m. decided nothing. A petition signed by 325 voters last week makes a referendum vote on all the items in the warning of the meeting mandatory on Monday, Feb. 28.

The election held forth on the School Building Committee report and answering of questions until well after 11 p. m. when a motion to end the discussion was voted with no opposition. No direct alternate proposal was put forth at the meeting although Mrs. Pearl Jewell, a Board of Education member, came closest to it. A great deal of talk had centered around two new schools in East Hartford described as "neighborhood, economy schools." Mrs. Jewell said she didn't feel anyone was trying to suggest that we build an East Hartford school in Bolton, but she felt the town should make a survey of this type of school and incorporate its finest points in plans for this town.

**Cooper Moderator**  
Raymond Cooper who was elected moderator took over Edmond Fawcett, kept the meeting in excellent order although it was apparent several times that personal feelings were no more in harmony than the viewpoint expressed. Cooper warned in opening the meeting there would be no personal exchanges and if anyone became too disorderly, the meeting would exercise its privilege to "throw them out."

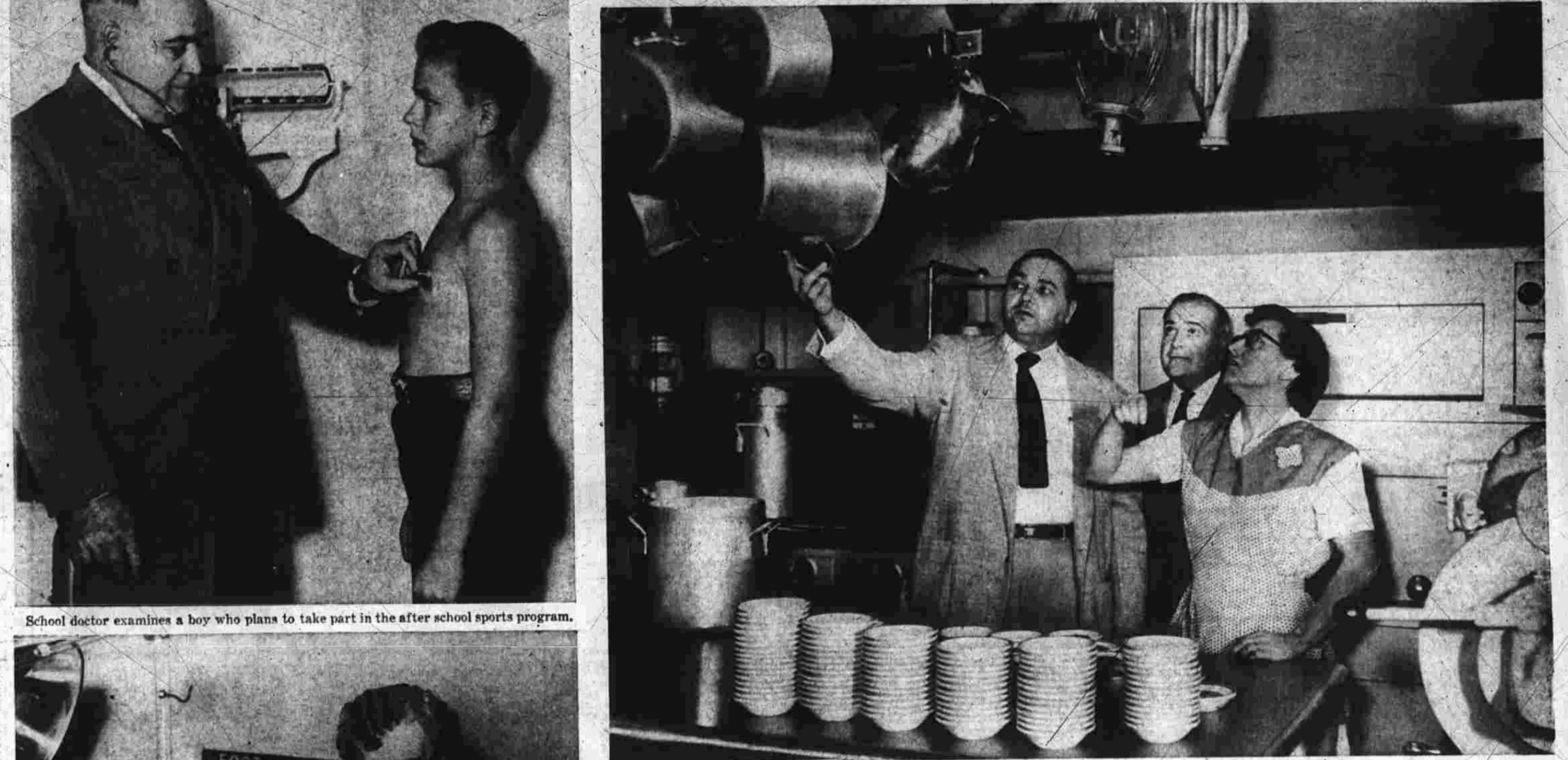

This group of photographs shows how the school attempts to guard the health of youngsters. Photos were taken by Arthur Lattime, of the department's audio-visual section.

It is the aim of the Manchester school system to cooperate with Manchester families in achieving the best possible physical health for their children. A child handicapped by defective eyes, ears, teeth, heart, or by other physical handicaps fails to receive the full benefit of the educational program.

In order to safeguard the health of its children, the State of Connecticut has set up certain basic requirements relative to health examinations for children of school age. State law requires that there shall be a health examination of each child at least once in each three year period and an annual vision test.

In Manchester the general physical examination is required of all children in grade one, four, seven and ten. This physical examination may be done by the family doctor with a report submitted to the school or at the school by the school medical advisor. The more extensive examination by the family physician is preferred and is therefore encouraged by the school.

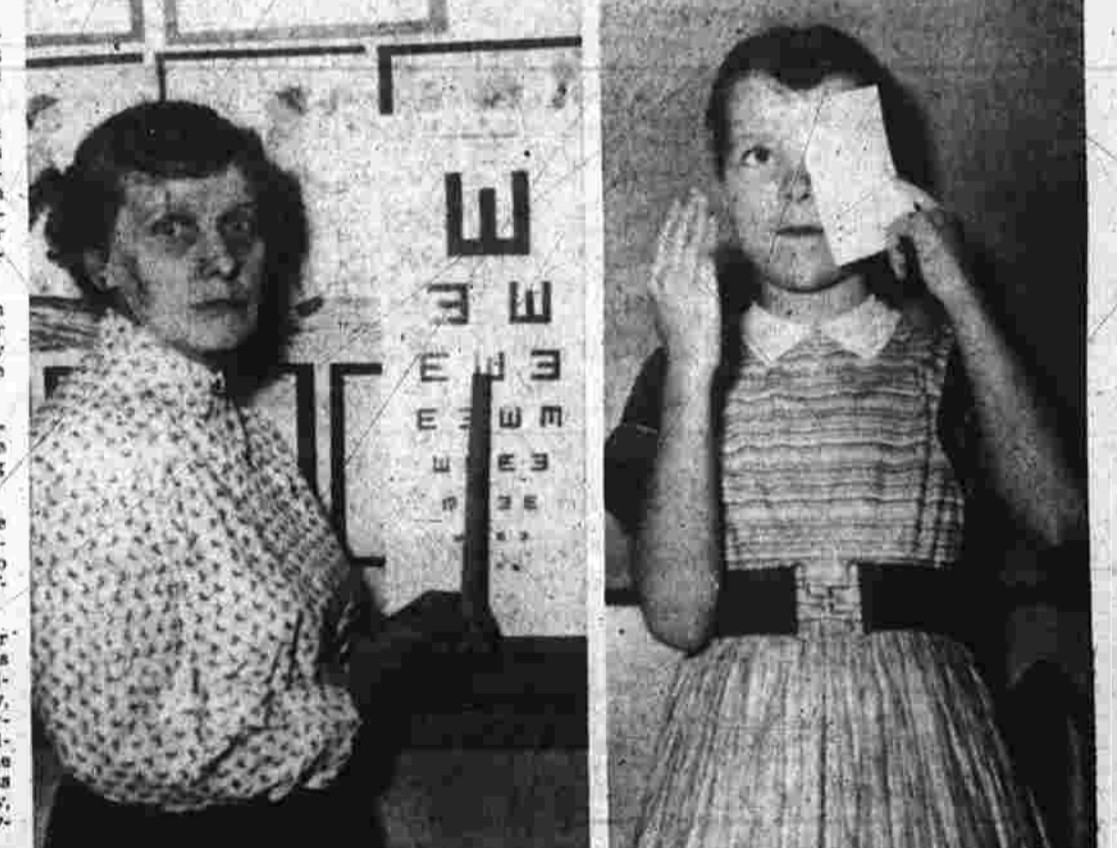
An important part of the three year general physical checkup is done by the school nurses who administer the Massachusetts Vision Test to note any indications of defective vision and an Audiometer Test to note any defects in hearing.

The eyes of children other than those receiving the three year general examination are tested by the classroom teacher who uses the Shelton Chart.

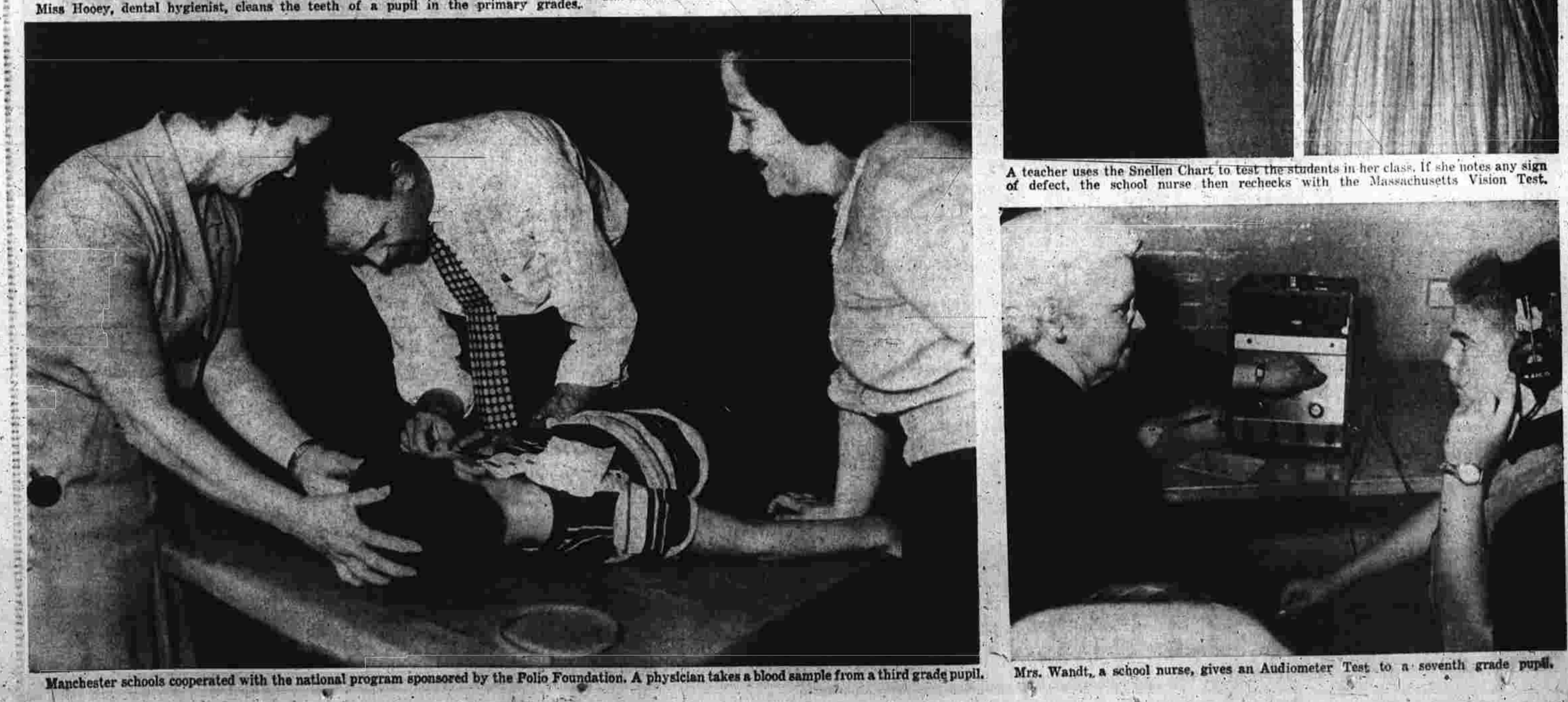
As a result of these examinations given in school parents are notified of conditions needing further study.

Pupils who wish to participate in the school-sponsored sports program after school hours are also required to pass a physical examination by the school doctor.
