believes the issue would provoke great controversy.

One of many straw men in the news which prompted the Chief Justice to such comment was that the Bill of Rights had actually been ruled a "controversial" document out of the Chief Justice's own state of California by the manager of a state office, who had forbidden one of his employees to put it in the office bulletin board.

But the more usual mention of the Bill of Rights, these days, come from those who object to the identity of some of those who have been employing the Fifth Amendment of late, and from those who have an instinct to drop the other guaranteed freedom, like those of speech and press and assembly, to individuals whom a majority of Americans regard as enemies.

Yet the Bill of Rights, of course, was adopted precisely for the protection of the individual American majority may disagree. Otherwise, there would have been no point in its adoption.

Our present instinct to depart from our own Bill of Rights, and to deny its privileges to some Americans, is not, the Chief Justice thought, the product of any one person or group.

"They are more properly chargeable," he said, "to the mainline, intolerant, and irresponsible attitude that stalks the world today and also to a lack of appreciation for the age-old struggle of mankind to achieve our present day blessings of liberty."

The questions he asked were: "Are the privileges and immunities summed up in our Bill of Rights in danger of loss through subtle changes in our climate of opinion? Is distrust of our fellow countrymen wearing away at traditional concept of the innate dignity of man?"

The answer is, of course, that we are in danger of forgetting much, as we concentrate on the special target. And, to be candid about it, some of the trimming of the Bill of Rights, in recognition of the special menace of Communism, has come from the Supreme Court itself.

As the New York Times observes, commenting on the Warren speech, "this nation has been going through a sort of fever in which fear of a foreign tyranny has made us fearful of domestic freedom. It is time we came out of it. We shall be stronger when we do so."

Third Degree For Harlan

We believe that, when he is on the bench, a member of the United States Supreme Court should disinterestedly of all organizational and political affiliations. We believe that, while he is on the bench, he should refrain from outside interests and activities and expressions of opinion.

We believe that, if he is not capable of doing this, he should get off the bench. These beliefs of ours also mean that, in the past decade, we have been critical of the actual behavior of more than one member of the Supreme Court, even when we happen to agree with the purpose of their extrajudicial activities.

Obviously, then, we also believe that Judge John Marshall Harlan, President Eisenhower's appointee to the Supreme Court, should, when he takes his seat, have nothing to do with outside organizations of any kind, and should not reflect, in his conduct on the bench, his past connection with such organizations.

Believing that, however, we also would label as most unfortunate and regrettable the kind of third degree Judge Harlan went through, the other day, before the Senate Judiciary Committee.

Here Judge Harlan's membership in the advisory committee of Atlantic Union, an organization which obviously believes in some degree of United States sovereignty, was presented to him as if it were some kind of crime. And he was pressured into making a statement that he was "no 'one worlder' or 'internationalist.'"

If he wasn't something of these things, his membership in Atlantic Union was in itself something of a fraud. And for him now to pretend that he has divested himself of all such dangerous thought is either an admission of incoherence in the past, or weakness now.

We should have preferred that he avoid such craven apology for his possible beliefs. We should have preferred that he had said that a good many good Americans hold the belief, today, that only by some surrender of national sovereignty to some international order of things can the safety of any individual nation be achieved.

If he were a man of good conscience, it would be obvious that he could hold such beliefs, in his life as a private citizen, and never seek to further them in his conduct on the Supreme Court, where his role would be judicial.

Bill of Rights Controversial?

Chief Justice Earl Warren, making a speech out at St. Louis last Saturday, said some thoughtful persons had begun to "ask the question whether ratification of the Bill of Rights could be obtained today if we were faced squarely by the issue.

"My faith in the other second thought of the American people," he went on, "makes me confident that it would now be ratified. But, on the other hand, I am not prepared to dispute with those who

Fluoridation and the Public (Article No. 5)

(Public interest has been stirred by the value of fluoridation of public water supplies in reducing the rate of dental decay among children. To bring its readers the latest information about this process, The Manchester Evening Herald, through the cooperation of the Manchester Dental Society, is presenting a series of articles on fluoridation. Today, public reaction to fluoridation is

nothing more than bringing the fluoridation content to a level where it helps prevent tooth decay. Fluoridation does not treat or reduce decay already existing in teeth.

In reply to suggestions that there be a further delay before fluoridation is adopted throughout the country, Dr. J. Roy Doty, secretary of the American Dental Association's Council on Dental Therapeutics, stated:

"The evidence to demonstrate the safety of the fluoridation procedure is so overwhelming that there is no justification for further delay to large numbers of children the benefits of better dental health which will result from this procedure."

The American Medical Association, noting that controlled fluoridation is harmless and beneficial, has also endorsed the measure.

So far the National Research Council, the U.S. Public Health Service, the American Academy of Pediatrics, State and Territorial Health Officers, the governing council of the American Public Health Association and every other major organization in the United States concerned with the health of the nation.

They have asked that no vote be influenced by the fact that Mrs. Driscoll, if confirmed, will be the first woman High Court judge in the state's history.

The only Republican leader on record in W. Sheffield Cowles, the speaker of the House, is expected at Bristol about two weeks ago. It has been reported that Mrs. Driscoll, in her long career as chief justice of the state, has been in difficult court cases, and that she is a woman of high character.
