### Communist Party Meddling Banned in Russian Courts

New York, March 16 UP.—The Central Committee of the Communist Party has ordered local party leaders to stop meddling in Soviet courts. A decree to this effect is revealed in a copy of the magazine Kommunist received here from Moscow.

The decree forbids local party organs from telling Soviet judges what decisions they are to hand down. So far as can be discerned the decree says nothing about interference by organs of the central Communist party, however.

The Kommunist article by Konstantin Gorsheinin, Soviet justice minister, says:

In some cases criminal punishment for such offenses will be replaced with administrative penalties.

Gorsheimin said the new laws will give increased guarantees of "inviolability of persons" and would provide increased punishment for illegal bringing of legal proceedings against persons.
