Knofla Seen Low Bidder On Skywatch

Fred Knofla was the apparent low bidder yesterday on the construction of a skywatch at the police station on E. Middle Type, with a bid of \$2,285.

Knofla said today he believed he could build the 10-foot by 10-foot structure within 10 days after construction begins.

Knofla, who was also the apparent low bidder for the remodeling of the Hall of Records, understood two other bidders who submitted prices on the sky-watch project.

The other bidders were William Kanehl, 519 Center St., who asked \$2,237; and W. G. McCall and Sons, 6 Morse Rd., who asked \$2,185.

Knofla's bid was \$215 under the \$2,500 approved by the Board of Public Works Reserve Fund for the project.

Plywood Finish The skywatch, which will be finished in plywood on the outside and sheetrock on the inside will be 17 1/2 feet high and located on the west side of the roof. A fire escape extension to the roof will permit skidwatches to be set up without going through the police station, and a catwalk will be used to eliminate the need for climbing on the roof.

Construction of the skywatch will permit the resumption of the Ground Observer Corps activities which were terminated when the old skywatch atop the Old Police Building at the Center was closed in January.

The Old Police Building Association has requested the abandonment of the tower, which had been dismantled on a round-the-clock basis since it was dismantled.

Since the closing of that skywatch, local Civil Defense and town officials held numerous discussions and surveyed many sites before deciding on the present location of the skywatch on the police station roof.

U.S. Entry Due for 20 Red Sailors

Washington, March 19 (AP)—The United States may be asked to grant asylum to some 20 Russian seamen who deserted their ship after it was seized off Formosa by the Chinese Nationalist Government.

Atty. Gen. Brownell, it was learned today, is expected to be in the national interest to admit the men.

The action, however, is virtually certain to provide a hot protest from Russia, which has been demanding the return of the men along with their ship.

The deserters are part of a 48-man crew captured last June 23 by Nationalist destroyers off Formosa. The ship was seized off Formosa, it is said, for Red China.

Will Return Ship It is understood that the Toppes along with the 28 crewmen who were turned over to Soviet authorities within a few weeks. The ship and all crewmen are now in Chinese Nationalist custody.

Under an asylum plan now being developed by the State Department, the crew members would be screened rigorously to make certain no members of the Communist Party or other subversives are permitted to enter the United States.

The decision to admit them will mean some six months of vigorous questioning by the State Department and other government departments involved in the problem.

Death for Admission Secretary of State Dulles is reported to have argued in favor of the move. With cold war repercussions in mind, he felt anxious that the seamen would encourage other Soviet sailors to desert and would be a source of trouble for the United States.

Churchill to Drop Premiership Soon

London, March 19 (AP)—Growing prospects of a general British election this year sparked fresh reports today that Prime Minister Churchill may step down before the strenuous campaign begins.

Three London newspapers—the pro-Churchill Evening Star—all carried reports that the 69-year-old leader was "about" to retire as Prime Minister.

Churchill has been thinking and talking about retiring for a long time. But his deep feeling for the job has kept him from such a step.
