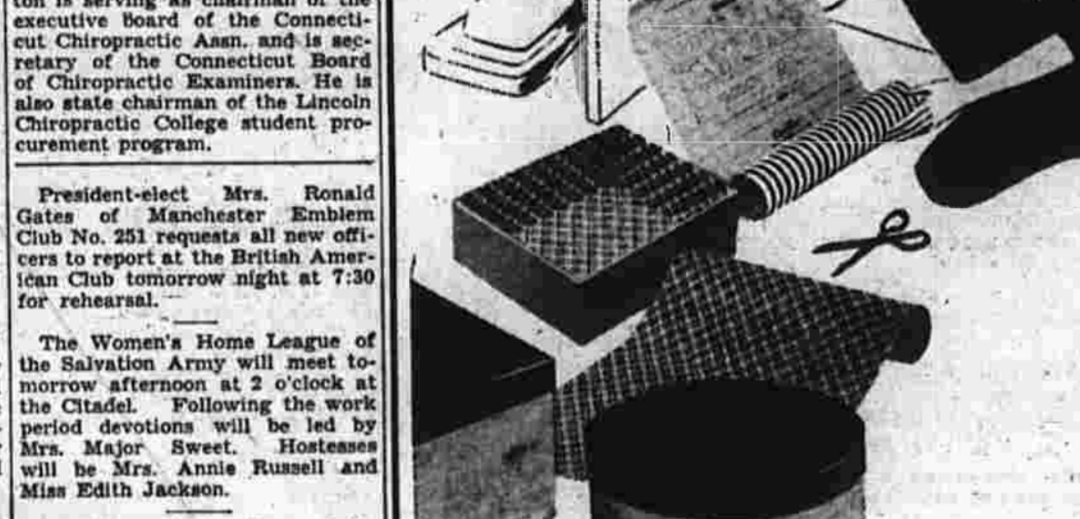

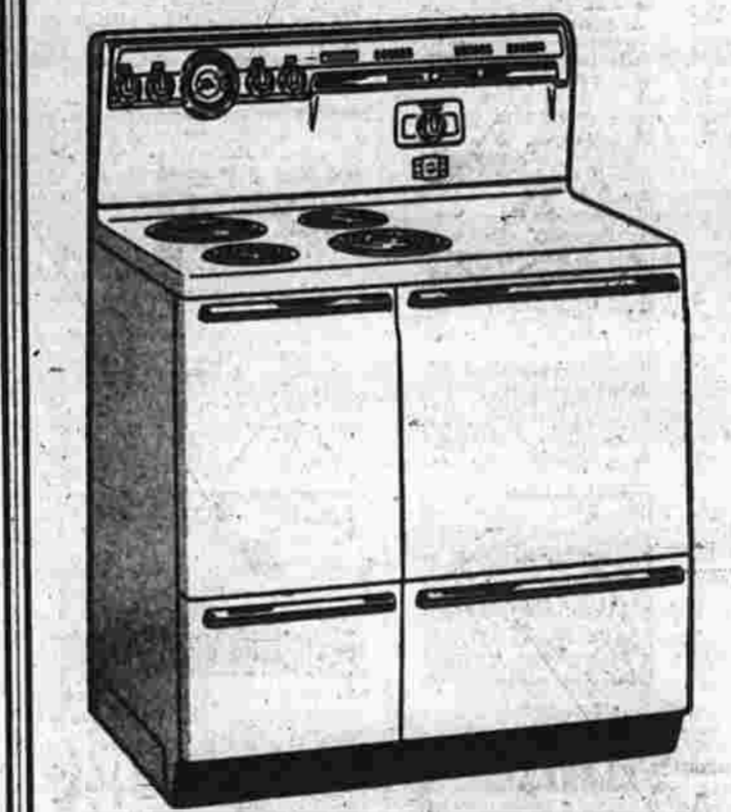

An apparent oversight on the part of Superintendent of Schools Arthur H. Illing has resulted in what turned out to be a pleasant surprise for members of the Board of Education last night.  
The surprise was that a teacher from Hawaii will come to Manchester next fall to teach the seventh grade at Barnard School. It all started several months ago when Illing, with the later approval of the Board, authorized a one-year leave of absence for Miss Emily Gove, a Barnard teacher. She wanted to teach in the Hawaiian Islands, and that, Illing thought, was all there was to it.  
However, earlier this month Illing received a letter from the Department of Public Instruction in Honolulu. It was written by Earl L. McTaggart, deputy superintendent, who said his department would be happy to have Miss Gove on its staff—and who at the same time notified Illing that Miss Alice Yoshimori was the teacher who would be sent from the 1955-56 school year.  
"It was probably very clear at the time Miss Gove applied for the leave," Illing said last night. "But I guess I just didn't realize it was an exchange proposition."  
In any event, the Board last night expressed its hearty approval of the arrangement, however it came about. Several expressed the view that it would not only benefit Miss Yoshimori but the seventh graders at Barnard as well.  
Miss Yoshimori, who is 27, was born in Wahiawa, on the island of Maui, and was educated in the islands.

**Dog Tags Slated For Civilian Use**

Hartford, March 22 (AP)—You'll be able to wear dog tags pretty soon.  
William Heeketh, State Director of Civil Defense, announced yesterday plans to make identification tags, similar to the servicemen's dog tags, available to Connecticut residents.  
"You'll be able to find out how to obtain them from any emergency grocery stores," Heeketh said.  
"The tags, approved by the Federal Civil Defense Administration (FCDA), are an important identification which would be helpful in case of accident or any emergency," he said.  
"Your tag will bear your name, address and the name of the person you want notified in an emergency. It'll also show your birth date and religious preference. You'll wear it on a non-removable chain."

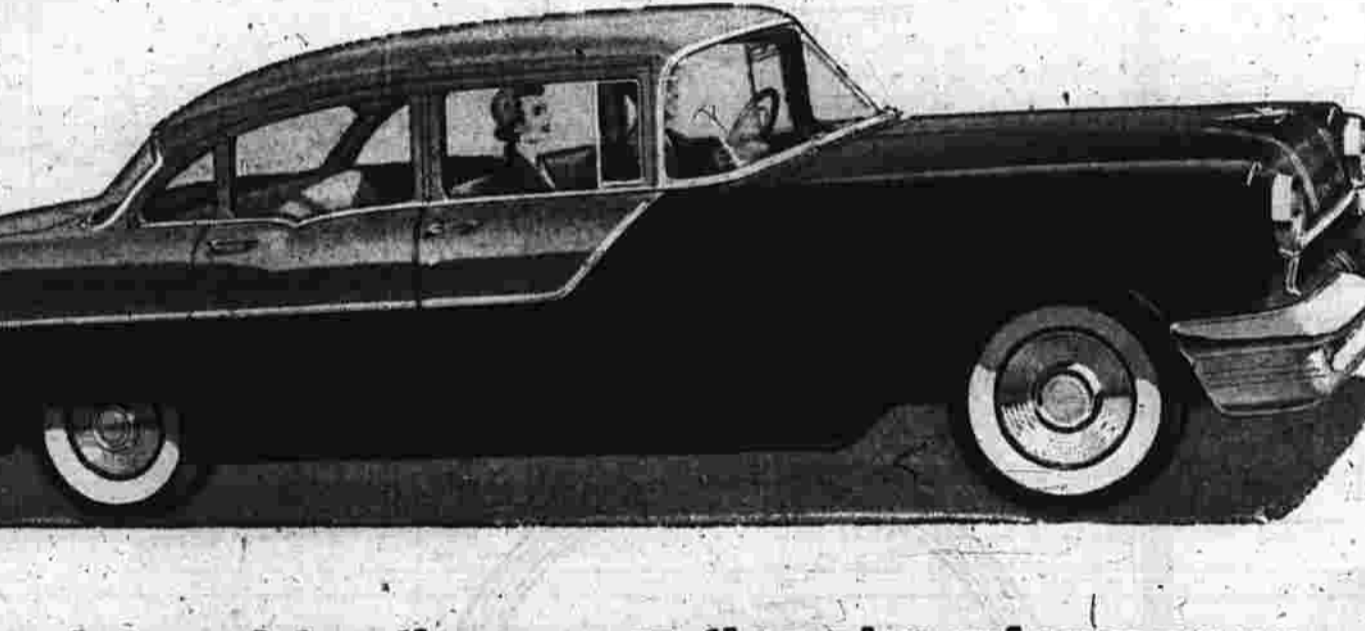

What he wanted then, Eisenhower said, was assurance that the Russians meant business. He said they had violated their promises so often and left us hanging on a limb that it made him wary.
