Molotov Poses Soviet Nuclear Power Riddle

By TOM WHITNEY (AP Foreign Staff)

Exactly what did Soviet Foreign Minister V. M. Molotov say about Soviet success with the H-bomb in his recent policy speech? The Russian leader frequently quoted as having declared on Feb. 8 that the U.S.S.R. leads the United States in manufacture of thermonuclear (hydrogen) weapons. Apparently, this is the impression the Soviet government would like the Western World to have. Since Molotov's statement, certain Soviet commentators have said precisely that. For instance, Maj. Gen. P. Levay, writing in a foreign affairs magazine primarily for circulation outside the Soviet Union, declared his country was well ahead of the United States in production of hydrogen weapons.

Statement Means Little

A careful examination of Molotov's remark in Russian, as reported in Pravda, indicates his statement can mean a lot or almost nothing, depending how one reads it. An expert American translator, who has done a lot of the translation work, renders the sentence in the Molotov speech this way:

"Russia reached such a point that in the production of the hydrogen weapon the Soviet people attained such success that it is not the Soviet Union but the United States which has found itself in the position of being backward."

A translation into English issued by the Soviet delegation to the United Nations reads:

"It has come to a point where the Soviet people have made such progress in the manufacture of hydrogen weapons that it is the United States that is lagging behind and not the Soviet Union."

An American expert on Russian language and grammar commented today:

"It seems to me to be deliberate vagueness. If Molotov wanted to say the Soviet Union is now at the present time ahead of the United States in its rate of production of H-bombs or in its stock pile of H-bombs, he could have said just that. Instead he used a rather indefinite phraseology."

Contradict Claim

If Molotov wanted to imply that the Russians at this time are stronger in thermonuclear building power than the United States, there are authorities to contradict the claim. Both President Eisenhower and Prime Minister Churchill have indicated the United States holds a big lead.

In the past Soviet spokesmen have seemed to encourage the broadest kind of interpretations of their atomic activities.

At the U.N. in 1949 Foreign Minister Andrei Vishinsky said the U.S.S.R. was using atomic energy to raise mountains, irrigate deserts, cut through jungles and tundra, and spread life, happiness and welfare in places where the human footstep has not been seen for thousands of years. When Pravda published Vishinsky's remarks, it made some changes, making it clear this was what the Soviet Union wanted to do, not what it was already doing.

Molotov himself spoke once before on nuclear weapons. On Nov. 6, 1947, he made an indefinite statement to the effect the United States no longer had a monopoly on the secret of the atomic bomb. This also was vague.

The Russians know from experience how little they have to say in order to start up comment on the subject of atomic energy. They know also how far away from the original sense citations of original Soviet statements can get. All this is important in psychological warfare.

Truce Pressed By Premier in South Viet Nam

South Viet Nam's rebellious religious sects today will negotiate with them if they will give up their private armies and special tax levies.

The sects, whose troops total some 50,000 or 60,000 men, have demanded that Diem give them more power in his government by Saturday or they will "appeal to the people."

Government spokesmen said Diem would issue a communique telling the sects he will discuss their demands if: (1) They admit the principle of a single national army with one commander at the head, and (2) they concede only the national government will levy and collect all taxes.

The Cao Dai and Hoa Hao sects and the allied Binh Xuyen society now operate half a dozen private forces in the south. They collect taxes and other revenue in considerable areas they control around Saigon and south and southwest of the capital.

Diem's government already includes eight representatives of the sects in the administration, completely through a secret revolutionary committee which would gas on all the Premier's actions.

Diem's major weapon outside military action by the national army appears to be the threat that the United States would not support a government controlled by the Cao Dai, Hoa Hao and Binh Xuyen. U.S. Embassy sources said yesterday such a regime would be unstable and unable to unify and strengthen South Viet Nam against the Communist threat from Red-controlled North Viet Nam.

When Congress has set the course and voted funds for the various activities of the budget, control of expenditure shifts back to the executive branch.

No Single Will Prevent Hardening of Arteries

Perhaps the first question which comes to mind is whether hardening of the arteries or arteriosclerosis is becoming more common. Probably it is, but this is most likely because fewer people die young from such diseases as pneumonia, diphtheria or typhoid and therefore reach an age when the walls of the arteries have become somewhat hardened and are producing symptoms.

The process of the arteries becoming less elastic starts early in life, but it is unusual to have symptoms from this change until the middle or later years. Just what symptoms will be caused from arteriosclerosis depends on which arteries are affected (since the process does not develop evenly in all of them), and to what degree the blood flow is lessened by the deposits of calcium fatty substances in the walls of the arteries.

possible that members of Congress would prefer to see present or future significant things were done.

Blumenthal said that so far as he is concerned there would be no secrets kept from Congress in connection with a conference at high levels.

The change in Russian leadership might open the way to some new hope for obtaining peace, the President observed. He said there was at least a faint hope that the new individuals at the head of the Russian government may be different from the old ones, adding that some information on this might be obtained through executive talks.

In response to questions, Blumenthal said he and Dulles had discussed the possibility of including the Germans in any world conference. But he said he assumed that the "big four" would be the United States, Britain, France and Russia.

The President said he did not want to kill any potential conference by putting down details in advance that might prevent the holding of a meeting.

He said that in the summer of 1951, five world representatives talked to the Russians for four months in Paris and could agree on no agenda for the holding of a conference.

Under further questioning, the President said it was completely academic at this time to discuss the possibility of including the Chinese Communists in a top level conference. He said that every suggestion made to the Red Chinese for a peaceful settlement in the Far East had been rejected.

Both diplomatic and political leaders had looked to Blumenthal's news conference for a clarification of a situation left clouded.

The new addition would mean a great increase in the number of cars available to handle larger funerals more easily, he added.
