### Center Church Here Plans To Erect \$85,000 Addition

Center Congregational Church, which observed its 175th anniversary last fall, will soon have a new \$85,000 addition, it has been learned.

The congregation voted to build an \$5 to \$9 addition at a meeting last Sunday night, moderated by Atty. Charles N. Crockett. He said the new structure will be used primarily for Sunday school service, now overcrowded in the present facilities.

A report of the plans was given by Edwin Whitman and he said the building will contain about 6,000 square feet. It will have entrances from Woodruff Hall and from the grounds level on the north side. The addition will extend toward the north from the present west wing of the church.

"Almost all the necessary funds for the new building were raised during a drive held about a year ago. The money is on hand or pledged to the church, so no fund raising will be necessary. Atty. Crockett explained that the drive for contributions held at that time was part of the church's 175th anniversary observance. The church for one week in October, the date was marked by special services and other buildings were handled by a church building committee headed by Edward Ellis and assisted by Malcolm R. Knorr of Bloomfield, a church architect who has offices in Hartford, Conn.

### Stevens Co. Now Owner Of Cheney's

Stevens Co., which manufactures and sells cotton, woolen, worsted and synthetic fabrics, was founded in 1815 and is one of the largest concerns in the textile industry.

It was 25 plants, six of them in New England and two of them in the South. Two of the New England plants are in New Hampshire and the other four in Massachusetts. The southern plants are located in North and South Carolina.

Last year, according to the company's annual report, its sales amounted to \$27,500,000. It had a working capital of \$11,625,071 and a net profit of \$1,191,000.

Cheney Bros., which has long been the single most important factor in the town's economy, has been hard hit by the depression which has gripped the textile industry. However, it remains the largest taxpayer in town, paying an assessment on the current grand list of \$7,776,804.

### Dules Reports Top Level Talk 'Months Away'
