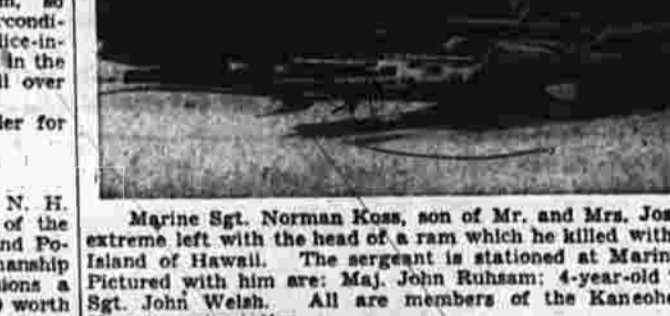

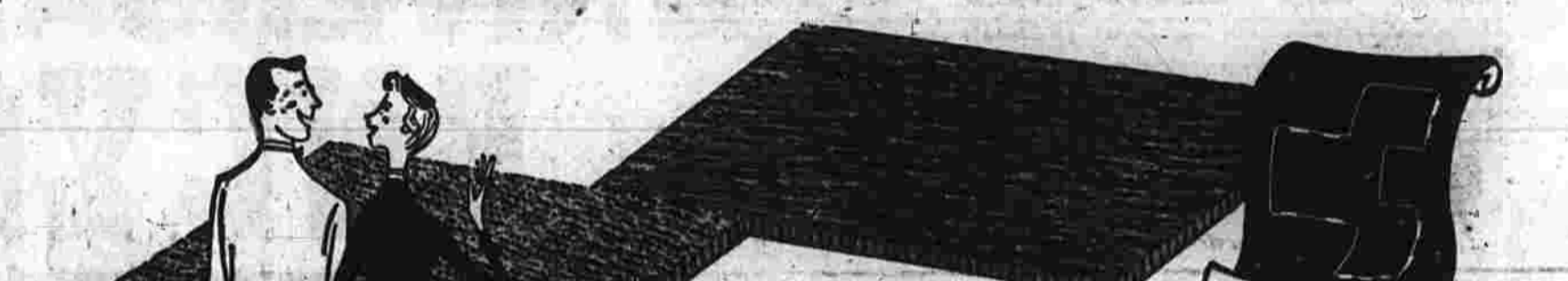

### Democrats Act To Extend Rent Curbs In State

Hartford, March 30 (AP)—Connecticut Democratic-controlled Senate has voted to continue rent controls for another two years but a Republican move was underway to defeat them in the House.

The Senate vote yesterday was 17-14, strict party-line. Republicans lined up solidly against the bill, an indication it would have little chance in the Republican-controlled House of Representatives.

The Connecticut Senate has 38 members.

Controls End June 8

Under present law, rent controls automatically end with the close of this session of the state legislature—not later than June 8.

The hour-long debate on rent controls was the second party line split of the day in the upper House. Earlier in the session the Senate passed through an administration bill.

Most observers felt that yesterday's vote has established the pattern to be followed for most major legislation during the session.

But there was some controversy talk on the highway bill. Advance indications were that the President would endorse Scelba's idea for a meeting of nine Western nations in Paris during May to try to lay the groundwork for a later disarmament conference with Russia.

It was not clear whether Eisenhower would agree that all nine nations should be included at a new, reduction conference with Russia, as Scelba suggested.

Besides holding the first airplane flight, Scelba will be building a calculating machine, a home telephone, a typewriter, a ballpoint pen, a printing press and many bicycle models.

### Press for Clear Rule On Publishing Record

Hartford, March 30 (AP)—How is it in one of two ways. Write far as can a newspaperman go in demanding access to public records? How far can a private citizen go?

These questions were before the Connecticut Legislature yesterday for a third time since 1951.

Asking for laws to spell out specifically the right of public access to records were a group of Connecticut newspapermen.

But opponents for such State departments as the State Police, Welfare, Health, and others urged that secrecy of their records be preserved.

**Bill Before Assembly**

All this came before the General Assembly's Judiciary Committee, which is considering a bill which proposes:

"All public records kept by the State or any official thereof, or by any town, municipality or subdivisions thereof, or by any provisions or requirements of law, shall be open to public inspection."

The newspaperman said they did not oppose this bill and agreed it was too broad. But they insisted on legislation to clarify the present situation.

Said Carter H. White, general manager of the Meriden Record and Journal:

"The law in the State right now is its considerable confusion."

The newspaperman and the public representative—nonetheless—is at a loss to know how far he can go in demanding access to records.

White spoke for the Connecticut Council of Freedom of Information and weekly newspapers and radio and television stations which he said regards itself as "a watchdog for the public."

Assuming that the bill before the committee was too broad, White said the control is anxious, however, for legislation "defining what the public's right to know is."

He said there is no specific law pertaining to land records, records of town meetings, records of the Secretary of State "or even of the Legislature itself."

## ATTENTION TAXPAYERS OF THE 8th DISTRICT

An Open Letter to Mr. Ray Warren, President Eighth School and Utilities District. Dear Sir:

As residents and taxpayers of the Eighth School and Utilities District there are several aspects and questions concerning the consolidation of the five districts that you should explain and answer. We request at the outset, that merely being residents does not entitle us to giving you advice. This advice is being extended to you however, in a helpful and friendly spirit and it is our hope that it will be accepted in this manner.

First of all, we feel that you were premature in sending your support to the Bill now before the Legislature. That will make the Charter amendments that will clear the way for consolidation in the future. For this reason, we would like to pose a few questions and cite a few problems that we feel you have not given sufficient thought to. If you have given them any thought at all you have very rarely in your duty, as head of the District, in appraising the members of the District of your conditions on them. First of all:

1. As President of the District, did you not feel that this matter was of sufficient importance to call a District meeting to discuss all of the ramifications that consolidation would entail? If you did, why was such a meeting never called when you knew as early as January of this year that you would support the Bill when it was presented to the Legislature?
2. Based on the fact that consolidation would require a new fire station at the center, one on McKee St. and one at the Green at an estimated cost of \$250,000, that necessary changes in the North End would require an additional \$300,000, and that necessary additional equipment and extension and repairs to the present alarm system would require an additional \$100,000 or more—have you canvassed or polled the members of the District to determine their willingness to assume these additional tax burdens?
3. Will the Fire Dept., under consolidation, be run on a voluntary basis or would it be a paid department? If it is a paid department would the workers receive the wages that our town employees now receive?
4. What will the rise in taxes be when and if the Town takes over the Eighth District?
5. Would the privately owned water supply in the District be adequate under the proposed consolidation?
6. What guarantee have you, as President of the District, or the District in general received that would assure us that none of the District's equipment would be transferred to another section in the event of consolidation?
7. How would the areas around the new districts be taxed?
8. How would the outlying areas without any water distribution systems be taxed?
9. What will happen to the equipment at the Company No. 1 on Pine Street, most of which is owned by Cherry Bros.? Will this in turn be turned over to the town without expense?
10. Consolidation will undoubtedly require a Town Fire Commission. How will the members of this commission be chosen? Will they be appointed or elected? Will they be volunteers or will they receive a salary? If they do receive a salary, what will that salary be?
11. It is reported that you have made the statement that "even if the whole Eighth District voted against the Bill (before the Legislature) I would support it." Do you care to explain this statement or can the members of the District, except this statement as your free view and feeling on the matter?
12. You very belatedly mention and views on these and other phases of the consolidation question certainly demand your clarification. Now for the friendly word of advice. You have heard it said that "You cannot serve two masters. The matter now before you has no such political implications. You, as President of this District, should certainly be aware of this truth and take immediate steps to protect the welfare and interests of those members of the District that have placed this high trust in you. Would you be wise to gauge your actions and express your views in such a manner that the members of the District would be assured that this trust was really justified?

36, and Warren B. Miller, 45, told newsmen they were well treated by the insurgents, who were armed with knives and pipes.  
A meager supply of bread and sugar was shared with scrupulous fairness among captives and captives alike, they said.  
Miller, jovial despite the ordeal, said he got the keys in the back two or three times. "I don't know the convicts but beyond that there had been no violence."  
"Everybody I talked to anyone on the phone (an inter-com linking the building with the warden's office) they kept a knife at my throat as a threat," Miller related.  
Gov. Anderson, virtually asleep since Sunday when he assumed personal command of the situation, prescribed 10 days in the hole with two meals a day, plus 60 days in solitary confinement with three meals a day for the insurgent convicts.  
The "hole" is the mass given to the first floor of the maximum security building. The small cells in it are barren and unadorned, representing the most extreme punishment given to prisoners of the state.  
The upper two floors of the building house segregation or solitary confinement cells.  
Newsmen who inspected the jail-within-the-prison after the revolt, noted a chamber with furnishings and fixtures wrecked.

**Hebron Report Indicates Library Growth**

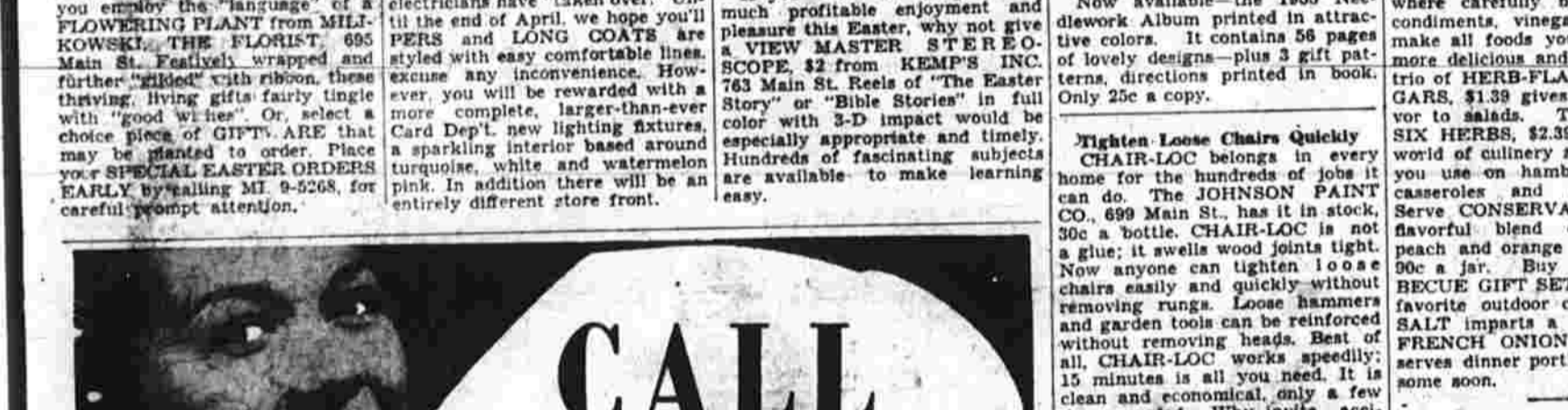

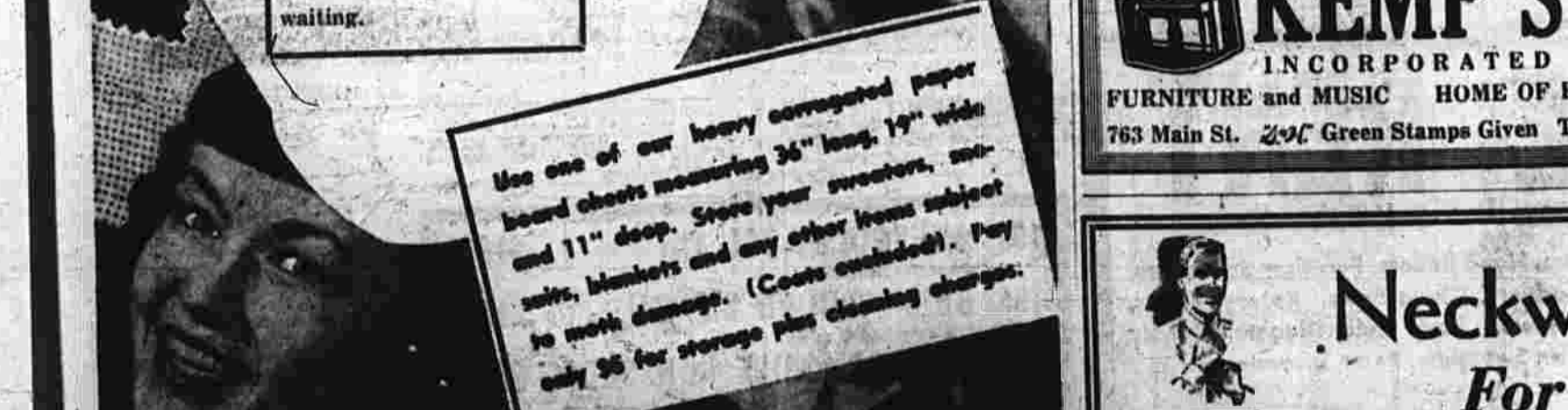
