Washington, April 21 (P)—The United States was reported today to have sent a hurry-up mission to Formosa to test Nationalist sentiment for a cease-fire line down the middle of the embattled Formosa Strait. Another factor credited in top congressional circles with influencing the mission was a reported atep-up in Russia's deliveries of late type jet planes to Red China. Adm. Arthur W. Radford, chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff and Asst. Secretary of State Walter S. Robertson left yesterday on a 10-day trip to the Nationalist Chinese capital, Taipei.
