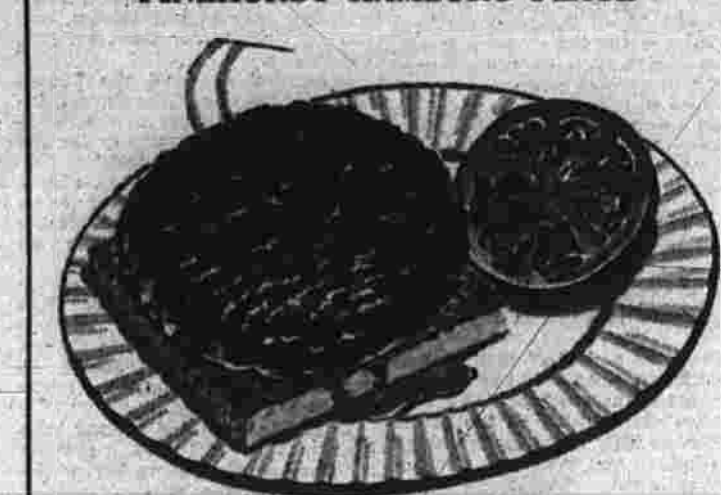

In this exchange of hospitality the Russians held the edge. Wealthy Wall Street imperialists had little more than stern countenance to offer. The simple countenance of the Russian officers had a certain charm. When they were on their feet, they were quick to get into the spirit of the occasion. After a polite greeting, they turned to the host and offered a strained look of a straight face.

After dinner a violinist who had been specially flown there from Paris entertained the group. When the violinist played a magnificent piece of music, Bradley replied with a straight face.

U.S. Stake in Formosa Dates to World War II

Washington, April 29 (AP)—This is a quick look at history.

How did the United States get so deeply involved with Chiang Kai-shek, with the island of Formosa, where he has his Nationalist government, and with the status and destiny of the island which has been a major issue in the war?

Chiang Kai-shek, who has been a major issue in the war, was an American ally in World War II. In 1943 at a Cairo conference, President Roosevelt, Prime Minister Churchill and Chiang Kai-shek agreed that Formosa should be returned to the Chinese after the defeat of Japan.

Japan had held Formosa since 1895 when the Chinese, then under a monarchy, lost a war with the Japanese and ceded the island to them. Formosa is 100 miles off the China coast.

Evacuation Plan For State Cities Held Incomplete

Hartford, April 28 (P) — State Police Capt. William L. Schatzman says it would be impossible to evacuate the 1,200,000 residents of Connecticut in the event of a nuclear attack. He said the evacuation of the state's population would be a mammoth task. Schatzman, chief of security for the State Office of Civil Defense, told a closing session of the Connecticut State Medical Society's convention yesterday it has been estimated that two hours would lapse between the first warning and the first bomb. He said the objective is to get as many residents as possible out of critical target areas. Plans for such a mass evacuation are incomplete, he added, but are under study.

State Insurance Firms Ask Continued Tax Reductions

Hartford, April 28 (P) — Surplus insurance companies are pressing for continued tax reductions in the tax on insurance interest and premiums of Connecticut insurance companies. The measure, under consideration yesterday at a public hearing of the Legislature's Finance Committee, would continue the gradual reduction in the tax which has been going on since 1948. At that time the Legislature established a scale aimed at reducing the tax by one-half of one percent each year until the tax reaches one-half of one percent in 1969 and thereafter.


