8 1/2% Boost In Postman Pay Backed

Washington, May 2 (AP)—One Senate-House conference on the postal pay increase bill said today a tentative agreement had been reached on a salary boost averaging 8 1/2 per cent.

This would be close to the 13 1/2 per cent increase voted by the House. The Senate passed a bill on Saturday evening at the Buckley School auditorium.

Washington, May 3 (AP)—President Truman and Eisenhower both reached a point in their White House years where things began to look a little better to them around the world.

Truman guessed wrong and remained in office long enough to find it out. Eisenhower has 21 months of his term left. That should be long enough to tell whether his present careful optimism is justified.

When Truman faced reporters on April 19, 1950, he had been in office five years and one day. A lot had happened in that time, some of it good for the United States, some of it not.

Tried to Halt Reds

In those five years, in which the wartime Allies had split and the cold war had begun, this country had taken a number of steps toward the spread of Communism.

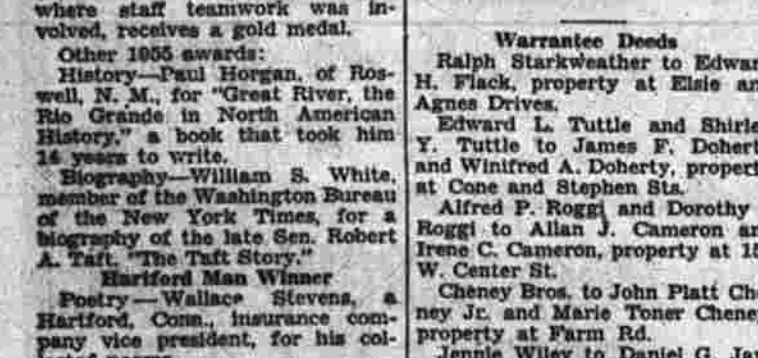
