# Scheele Lauds Anti-Polio Plan

Behind the Scheele administration's stand that voluntary methods will be adequate to assure that the vaccine is distributed first to children in the age groups most susceptible to polio.

Committee Chairman Eugene (Doc) had said in advance of the hearings that he feels "we need some legislation to make sure the vaccine goes to the children first without regard to ability to pay for it."

Scheele said he has great confidence in the vaccine which will protect polio despite the fact that 44 million children have been vaccinated. He said the vaccine has been shown to be effective in the laboratory.

At the moment, Dr. Scheele added, all vaccine being produced is being distributed to the National Foundation for Infantile Paralysis for inoculation for first and second graders.

Dr. Scheele referred only vaguely to a group of "the nation's top scientists" who he said have been asked to make a statement here and there on the subject.

Scheele indicated the conference might prescribe some conditions on which the vaccine would be distributed. He said he understands a few conditions which he would like to see included in a statement.

Scheele said without elaborating that he is confident the anti-polio vaccine can be made available to all children in the United States.
