Jobless Claims Down in State

Claims for unemployment compensation in the Manchester area remained almost unchanged last week, according to the weekly report of the State Labor Department.

The number of claims here last week was 466, two more than the 464 of two weeks ago. Initial claims rose from 60 to 80. Initial claims indicate new spells of unemployment.

The number of claims throughout the state, meanwhile, continued to decline, according to the report. It said that the number had dropped from 25,810 to 24,554.

Largest declines were in Norwalk, where there was a 20 per cent drop; New Britain, 19 per cent; and Willimantic, 18 per cent.

Norwich, on the other hand, reported a 50 per cent increase. Last week, during the corresponding two weeks, claims rose to 23,750 from 27,147.

Women claimants last week numbered 11,784, or 48 per cent of the total. Initial claims in the State remained almost unchanged last week at 3,467.

During the preceding week there were 3,454 such claims. A year ago, initial claims rose to 5,934 from 4,321.

Hartford continued to lead the State in the number of claims received at a regional office with 3,431. Bridgeport was second, with 2,200.

Followed by New Haven with 2,638. Waterbury, which reported 2,856, was the only other office reporting more than 2,000 claimants.

Reports from other offices were Stamford, 1,274; Norwich, 1,180; Danbury, 1,201; Easton, 1,180; New London, 1,171; Meriden, 1,065; New Britain, 1,000; Torrington, 867; Thompsonville, 832; Norwalk, 807; Middletown, 732; Bristol, 608; Ansonia, 549 and Willimantic, 500.

Groton, Conn., May 12 (AP)—The atomic submarine Nautilus is expected to make a second try today at starting on its first long shakedown cruise.

The Nautilus returned to her berth here yesterday after a steam pipe burst when the sub was off Block Island, N. I. She had sailed out on the cruise Tuesday with Adm. Robert Carney, Chief of Naval Operations, on board.

The spokesman said the break in the steam pipe occurred after Adm. Carney was transferred to another ship off Long Island for a flight back to Washington.

The break was so small, the Navy said, that the submarine could have continued on its journey. But she was close to her base at the Electric Boat Division of the General Dynamics Corp. and Cmdr. Eugene F. Wilkinson decided to take her back for the repairs.

The Navy says the Nautilus first long sea journey will take her to Puerto Rico.

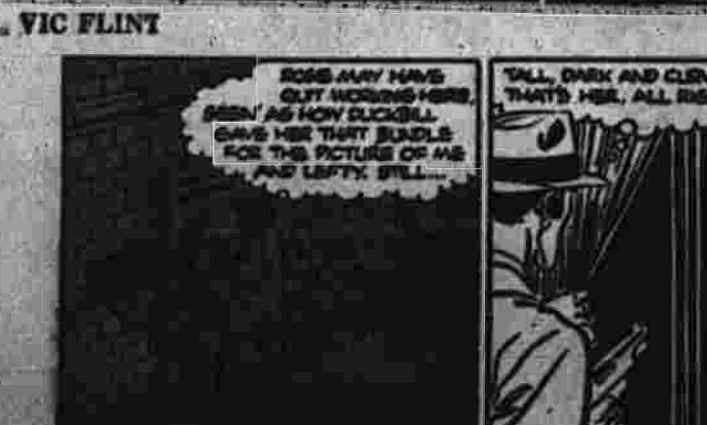
