

Scientists Hold To '54 Dosages

Washington, May 21 (/P)—A possible further slowdown of the mass anti-polio inoculation of school children loomed to-day as the government reportedly contemplated further tightening of safety standards for the Salk vaccine.

Meanwhile, the government—on advice of a panel of scientists—decided to continue the dosage and vaccination procedure worked out in last year's field trials of the polio pre-

cedure worked out in last year's field trials of the polio preventive.

Because of the vaccine scarcity, there had been discussion of possibly reducing the dosage—now 1 cubic centimeter per shot—and changing the method of injection to spread supplies. The government also decided against curtailing inoculations during the summer height of the polio season. Although the "advisory group did say the most favorable time for vaccine during a polio outbreak "has its place in preventive medicine."

Some doctors had veiced concern lest administration of the vaccine during such a period might provoke the disease.

New Delay Looms

Resumption of vaccine shipments after one safety recheck halt had been hoped for next week, But the possibility of a new delay in distributing the vaccine stose when vaccine manufacturers said their technical specialists had been called to a Monday conference here. The subject: new safety standards.
