The Doctor Says

Never Delay Treatment Because of Fear of Cancer

Notices or lumps may appear in the breast at almost any age. There are several kinds and some are relatively harmless. Because of the danger that any lump may be cancerous they should never be neglected. When there is doubt as to the nature of the breast lump it is best to have it taken out.

Many physicians now feel that mature women should learn how to examine their own breasts. This can be done under the instruction of their physician; an excellent motion picture put out by the American Cancer Society is also useful. If the examination is done satisfactorily about once a month early and will thus allow a woman to seek professional advice at once with consequent excellent chances for complete recovery.

The finding of a nodule in the breast is beyond doubt the most important early sign to watch for. The belief that one cannot have cancer of the breasts unless the nipples are pulled in, where there is dimpling of the skin of the breast or other symptoms, is dangerous. It is, however, true that

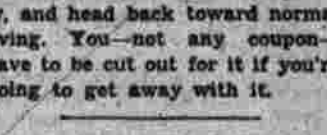

But, meanwhile, most of the 14 political and civic leaders present last night decided to let the issue come up for hearing by the City and Borough Committee today scheduled and to split the salary and appointment issues into two bills so that the voters will be able to vote on them separately.
