Trojan Horse of Literacy. Our Central Intelligence Agency, its director, Allen W. Dulles, has been making an exhaustive study of the Russian educational system.

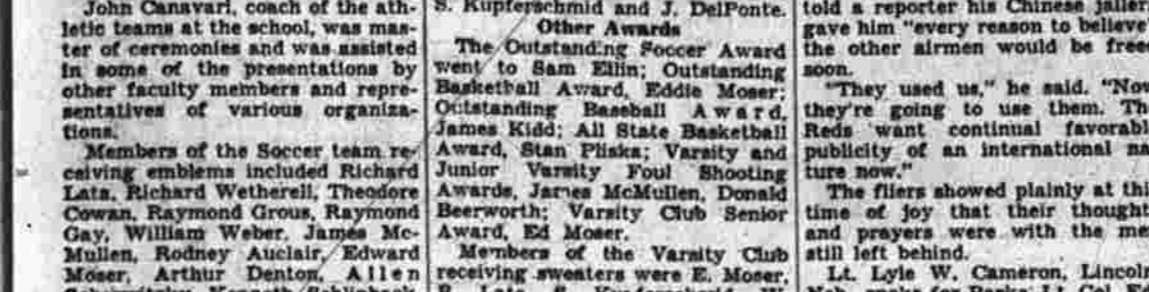

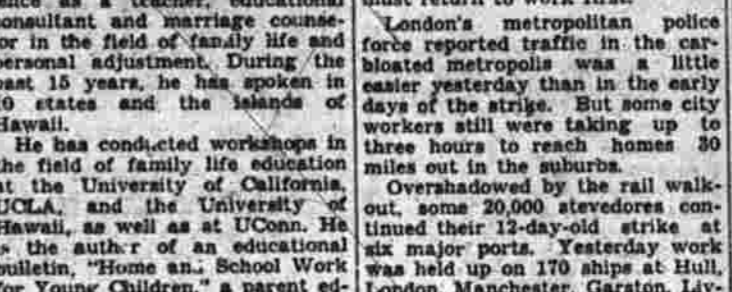

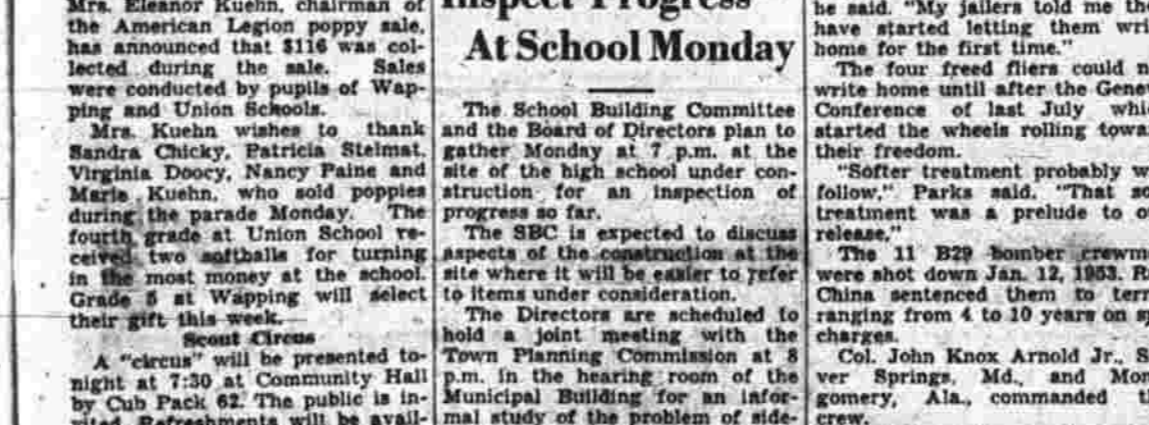
