



Fete Marks Hale's Birth AtCoventry

Coventry, June 6 (Special)-More than 2,500 persons from throughout New England con-verged Saturday afternoon beneath threatening skies to hear the story of Nathan Hale, America's patriot spy, retold by Bern-hard Knollenberg, former librarian

The deremonies were stage in the restored and furnished Hale Homestead where Hale was born 200 years ago today. The day's speakers, including Gov. A. A. Ribicoff, praised the patriot's bravery, sacrifice and love of country as part of the tradition which helped found this country.

Antique battle drums, the presence of ladies wearing ancient Colonial costumes, and flags displaying only the start of the 13 original American colonies helped relive the Revolutionary Wer era.

Main Speech
Knollenberg, who delivered the main speech, is a former librarian at Yale and is a scholar of the Revolutionary Wer period. He stressed the importance of Nathan Hale "as a symbol and as a man," and went on to trace the evolution and went on to trace the evolution of Haie's last words before his hanging: "I only regret that I have but one life to lose for my Other speakers told of the fighting at Boston, Brooklyn Heights, Manhattan, and other historical battles. Hale's life history was retold including the capture of the Yale graduate, schoolmaster, Army captain and finally American marky.

given a hazy picture of Capt. Hale who kept a rendezvous with his-tory. Supposedly he was made a captain on New Year's Day, 1776. In September of that year the tide of war was running in favor of the British. Gen. Washington urgently needed information concerning the enemy's strength and position.

Hale answered the call for volunteers, and left for New York in a schoolmaster's uniform. He made sketches of the British fortifications, and made notes in Latin. He was caught and hanged, and uttered his famous words at his execution.
